Senate Bill 624-FN as introduced prohibits the sale of hemp-derived products containing more than 0.3 percent THC, establishes penalties for unlawful possession and sale, requires liquor licensees to comply, and bars individuals under 21 from purchasing, possessing, or consuming THC-containing hemp products. The amendment adopted by the committee revises the definition of hemp to use a total THC calculation, adds a definition of “container,” sets a 0.4 milligram total THC per-container limit for final products, adjusts penalty structures, and expressly prohibits licensees from selling or furnishing such products to persons under 21.
