4 Recommendation:

5 That the House recede from its position of nonconcurrency with the Senate amendment, and
6 concur with the Senate amendment, and

7 That the Senate and House adopt the following new amendment to the bill as amended by the
8 Senate, and pass the bill as so amended:

10 Amend the bill by replacing section 1 with the following:

12 1 New Subparagraphs; Elections; Voting Procedure; Accessible Voting Systems. Amend RSA
13 659:20-b,I by inserting after subparagraph (a) the following new subparagraphs:

14 (1) If the governing body of a city, town, or school district believes the accessible
15 voting system will not be used by a registered voter at an election, the clerk shall post a notice on the
16 website and one other public location between 90 and 180 days prior to the election stating that the
17 accessible voting system will not be available for use on election day unless a registered voter
18 notifies the clerk of their intent to use the system in writing at least 60 days before the election.
