

1 Committee of Conference Report on HB 1469-FN-A, relative to the licensing requirements for  
2 massage therapy establishments.

4 Recommendation:

5 That the House recede from its position of nonconcurrency with the Senate amendment, and  
6 concur with the Senate amendment, and

7 That the Senate and House adopt the following new amendment to the bill as amended by the  
8 Senate, and pass the bill as so amended:

10 Amend RSA 328-B:14, II as inserted by section 10 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

11

12 II. In addition to licenses issued under paragraph I, the executive director may issue an  
13 establishment license to an applicant who is a natural person and does not hold a personal massage  
14 therapist license provided that the owner employs a licensed massage therapist as manager. This  
15 paragraph shall not authorize such owner to personally engage in massage therapy.

17 Amend RSA 328-H:18, II as inserted by section 17 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

18

19 II. In addition to licenses issued under paragraph I, the board may issue an establishment  
20 license to an applicant who is a natural person and does not hold a personal reflexologist, structural  
21 integrator, or Asian bodywork therapist license provided that the owner employs a licensed  
22 reflexologist, structural integrator, or Asian bodywork therapist as manager. This paragraph shall  
23 not authorize such owner to personally engage as a practitioner under this chapter.
