STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-Six

AN ACT relative to the composition of the state water well board.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Water Management and Protection; New Hampshire Water Well Board; Water Well Board.
2 Amend RSA 482-B:3, I to read as follows:

3 I. There is created a board to be known as the New Hampshire water well board. The water
4 well board shall be administered by the commissioner of environmental services. The board shall
5 consist of [7] 8 members who are residents of the state, appointed by the governor with the advice
6 and consent of the council as follows: one member shall be the commissioner, department of
7 environmental services, or designee; one shall be the state geologist; 2 shall be active water well
8 contractors with at least 10 years of experience; one shall be an active pump installer with at least
9 10 years of experience; one shall be an active technical driller licensed in the state of New
10 Hampshire with at least 10 years of experience; **one shall be an active water treatment**
11 **professional with at least 10 years of experience;** and one shall be a member of the public who
12 has demonstrated concern for and knowledge of water resources management in New Hampshire.
13 Each member shall hold office for a term of 3 years and until a successor is appointed and qualified.
14 No member shall serve more than 2 consecutive terms. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for
15 the unexpired term. The governor and council may remove any member of the board for good cause.

16 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
