AN ACT                   relative to the maximum amount of terms an individual can serve on the electricians' board.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1           1 Electricians; Board. Amend RSA 319-C:4, I and I-a to read as follows:

2           I. There shall be an electricians' board consisting of 5 members, including 2 master  
3 electricians, one journeyman electrician, and 2 public members, each to be appointed by the  
4 governor, with the approval of the council, to a term of 5 years. No member of the board shall be  
5 appointed to more than ~~[2]~~ **3** terms. The state fire marshal or his designee shall be an ex officio  
6 member of the board, but shall not vote in board determinations.

7           I-a. No member of the board shall serve more than ~~[12]~~ **16** years, including the time of ~~[2]~~ **3**  
8 5-year terms, being held over after a term expires, and fulfilling an unexpired term. Members' terms  
9 shall be staggered and in no case shall any member's term coincide with another member's term. To  
10 avoid coinciding terms, the next appointment for a member shall be for a term which complies with  
11 this paragraph.

12          2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
