This bill would enable wine and beverage manufacturers to offer tastings and sales of products from other New Hampshire-based wine and beverage manufacturers. Expanding choices would benefit businesses, consumers, and distributors alike. The Committee Amendment would prohibit an employee from authorizing intentional damage caused by the application of stickers, tags, markings, or other materials, to a product's label or packaging. If a product was defaced without the knowledge of the licensee, they would not be subject to penalties.
