HOUSE BILL ***1080-FN***

AN ACT prohibiting the sale of condoms and personal lubricant that contain intentionally added per and polyfluoroalkyl substances.

ANALYSIS

This bill prohibits the sale of condoms and personal lubricant that contains intentionally added per and polyfluoroalkyl substances.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ACT prohibiting the sale of condoms and personal lubricant that contain intentionally added per and polyfluoroalkyl substances.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Subparagraph; Consumer Products; PFAS Use Restricted; Condoms and Personal
2 Lubricants. Amend RSA 149-M:64, IV by inserting after subparagraph (i) the following new
3 subparagraph:

4 (j) Condoms and personal lubricants, including vaginal and anal.

5 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
