HOUSE BILL **1212**

AN ACT establishing a commission to review draft rules related to minimum standards for public school approval and state academic standards developed by the department of education.

ANALYSIS

This bill creates a commission to review all drafts of education rules related to minimum standards for public school approval and state academic standards.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-Six

AN ACT establishing a commission to review draft rules related to minimum standards for public school approval and state academic standards developed by the department of education.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Subparagraph; Review Commission Established. Amend RSA 193-E:2-a, IV by inserting
2 after subparagraph (d) the following new subparagraph:

3 (e) Pursuant to RSA 193-E:1, II, related to the state's responsibilities in establishing
4 minimum standards for public school approval and state academic standards, a commission shall be
5 established to review all drafts of education rules related to minimum standards for public school
6 approval and state academic standards developed by the state board of education and New
7 Hampshire department of education prior to submission to the general court, per RSA 541-A.
8 Minimum standards for public school approval and state academic standards shall not be submitted
9 to the state board of education without a completed written review from the commission. The
10 establishment of the commission for minimum standards for public school approval and state
11 academic standards shall be the direct responsibility of the commissioner of education or designee.

12 (1) The members of the commission shall be as follows:

13 (A) Two members representing the New Hampshire School Administrators
14 Association. One member shall represent superintendents or assistant superintendents and one
15 member shall represent curriculum, instruction, and assessment administration at a district level.

16 (B) Three members representing New Hampshire Association of School
17 Principals. One member shall represent elementary leadership. One member shall represent
18 middle level leadership. One member shall represent high school level leadership.

19 (C) Three members representing New Hampshire Association for Supervision
20 and Curriculum Development. These members shall represent direct responsibilities for curriculum,
21 instruction, assessment, and professional learning systems within New Hampshire public schools.

22 (D) The commissioner of education, or designee.

23 (E) Three high school teachers, appointed jointly by the National Education
24 Association of New Hampshire (NEA-NH) and the American Federation of Teachers of New
25 Hampshire (AFT-NH).

26 (F) Three middle school teachers, appointed jointly by NEA-NH and AFT-NH.

27 (G) Three elementary school teachers, appointed jointly by NEA-NH and AFT-
28 NH.

1 (H) One member shall represent state or national expertise in the area of
2 competency-based education. This member shall be nominated by members of the commission. The
3 commission, by a majority vote, will appoint the competency-based education expert.

4 (2) The commission shall recommend language for the minimum standards for
5 public school approval and state academic standards that support:

6 (A) Competency-based education principles for all public schools.

7 (B) Adequate education requirements as outlined in RSA 193-E:1 and RSA 193-
8 E:2 to maintain high quality minimum standards for public school approval and integrated systems
9 of shared responsibility between state and local government.

10 (C) Research-and evidence-based practices and strategies related to the content
11 areas articulated in RSA 193-E:2-a, I and RSA 193-E:3-b, I.

12 (D) School reporting of accountability for the opportunity of an adequate
13 education per RSA 193-E:3-b.

14 (E) Professional learning opportunities for school administrators and educators.

15 (F) Implementation of the education rules related to minimum standards for
16 public school approval and state academic standards.

17 (3) The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the
18 members. The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the first named member of the
19 commission, excluding the commissioner of education. The first meeting of the commission shall be
20 held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Ten members of the commission shall
21 constitute a quorum. Members of the commission shall serve a minimum of 3 years and a maximum
22 of 6 years.

23 (4) The commission shall report its recommendations for proposed changes to the
24 education rules related to the minimum standards for public school approval and state academic
25 standards to the New Hampshire department of education and state board of education within 120
26 days of any draft of education rules and state academic standards presented to the commission by
27 the New Hampshire department of education. All meetings and reports of the commission shall be
28 available to the public as specified in RSA 91-A.

29 (5) The commission shall determine the work schedule and organizational plan to
30 complete the review process within the specified timeline. This may include additional work
31 sessions with various groups of New Hampshire public school educators. The commission shall
32 make all decisions related to its recommendations using a simple majority vote of the commission
33 members.

34 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
