ANALYSIS

This resolution urges the United States Congress to rescind President Donald Trump's tariffs by terminating the national state of emergency declared by President Trump on April 2, 2025. The resolution also urges the United States Congress to oppose all future declarations of states of emergency through the International Emergency Economic Powers Act that would permit future tariff increases by President Trump.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

A RESOLUTION       urging the United States Congress to rescind President Donald Trump's tariffs.

1       Whereas, on April 2, 2025, President Trump declared a national emergency pursuant to the  
2 International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA), which enabled him to impose a 10 percent  
3 base tariff on all foreign goods imported from foreign countries into the United States and even  
4 higher tariffs on specified trading partners; and

5       Whereas, low-income American households have been hit hardest by the price increases caused  
6 by President Trump's tariffs, with essential goods like food, clothing, electronics, and used vehicles  
7 rising in cost already; and

8       Whereas, economists broadly agree that tariffs function as taxes on imports, which are passed on  
9 to consumers and businesses in the form of higher prices; and

10       Whereas, increases in the cost of imported goods by President Trump's tariff policies will lead to  
11 higher costs of living for New Hampshire residents and higher operating costs for New Hampshire  
12 businesses; and

13       Whereas, Canada is New Hampshire's number one export market, totaling \$1.4 billion in annual  
14 goods; and

15       Whereas, New Hampshire imports \$2 billion in goods from Canada annually, including \$444  
16 million in fuel oil, \$111 million in fish and crustaceans, and \$78 million in wood products; and

17       Whereas, Canadian government officials have said that a tariff on these imports from Canada  
18 will directly result in higher costs for New Hampshire residents for goods such as gas, seafood,  
19 groceries, fresh fruits and vegetables like blueberries and potatoes, durable goods, and housing  
20 production; and

21       Whereas, 182,000 New Hampshire jobs rely on international trade, and economic burdens  
22 caused by President Trump's tariff policies threaten to reduce employment opportunities and  
23 diminish the Granite State's overall economic output; now, therefore, be it

24       Resolved by the House of Representatives:

25       That the New Hampshire house of representatives urges the United States Congress to enact a  
26 joint resolution to rescind President Trump's tariffs by terminating the national state of emergency  
27 declared by President Trump on April 2, 2025, and to oppose all future declarations of states of  
28 emergency through the IEEPA that would permit future tariff increases by President Trump; and

29       That copies of this resolution be forwarded by the house clerk to the President of the United  
30 States; President of the United States Senate; the Speaker of the United States House of
