AN ACT relative to the assault of emergency room personnel.

This bill establishes felony-level offenses for the assault of emergency room personnel.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-Six

AN ACT relative to the assault of emergency room personnel.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Assault and Related Offenses; First Degree Assault. Amend RSA 631:1, I(c)-(d) to read as
2 follows:

3 (c) Purposely or knowingly causes injury to another resulting in miscarriage or stillbirth;
4 [~~or~~]

5 (d) Knowingly or recklessly causes serious bodily injury to a person under 13 years of
6 age; **or**

7 (e) ***Knowingly causes serious bodily injury to any emergency room personnel***
8 ***acting in the line of duty. For purposes of this subparagraph, "emergency room personnel"***
9 ***means a person in a hospital emergency department who, in the course and scope of their***
10 ***employment or as a volunteer, provides services or medical care, or who assists in the***
11 ***providing of services or medical care, for the benefit of the general public, including, but***
12 ***not limited to, any health care professional, emergency department clerk, emergency***
13 ***department technician, student, and emergency department volunteer working in the***
14 ***hospital emergency department.***

15 2 Assault and Related Offenses; Second Degree Assault. Amend RSA 631:2, I(e)-(f) to read as
16 follows:

17 (e) Recklessly or negligently causes injury to another resulting in miscarriage or
18 stillbirth; [~~or~~]

19 (f) Purposely or knowingly engages in the strangulation of another; **or**

20 (g) ***Knowingly causes bodily injury to any emergency room personnel acting in***
21 ***the line of duty. For purposes of this subparagraph, "emergency room personnel" means a***
22 ***person in a hospital emergency department who, in the course and scope of their***
23 ***employment or as a volunteer, provides services or medical care, or who assists in the***
24 ***providing of services or medical care, for the benefit of the general public, including, but***
25 ***not limited to, any health care professional, emergency department clerk, emergency***
26 ***department technician, student, and emergency department volunteer working in the***
27 ***hospital emergency department.***

28 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2027.
