HOUSE BILL **1416**

AN ACT prohibits certain government regulations regarding pregnancy resource centers in connection with abortion and contraception service offerings.

ANALYSIS

This bill:

I. Prohibits the state, state agencies or subdivisions, or any municipality from adopting certain regulations regarding abortion and contraception service offerings.

II. Allows pregnancy resource centers or persons harmed by violations of this act to sue the state, state agencies or subdivisions, or municipality for damage or injunctive relief.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-Six

AN ACT prohibits certain government regulations regarding pregnancy resource centers in connection with abortion and contraception service offerings.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Short Title. This act may be known and cited as the "Pregnancy Resource Center Freedom of
2 Expression Act".

3 2 Statement of Findings. The general court hereby finds that:

4 I. The life-affirming impact of pregnancy resource centers on the women, men, children, and
5 the communities they serve is considerable and growing.

6 II. Pregnancy resource centers serve women with integrity and compassion in New
7 Hampshire and across the United States.

8 III. Pregnancy resource centers provide comprehensive care to women and men facing
9 unexpected pregnancies, including resources to meet their physical, psychological, emotional, and
10 spiritual needs.

11 IV. Pregnancy resource centers offer women free, confidential, and compassionate services,
12 which may include pregnancy tests, peer counseling, 24-hour telephone hotlines, childbirth and
13 parenting classes, referrals to community health care, adoption referrals, and other support services.

14 V. Many medical pregnancy resource centers offer ultrasounds and other medical services.

15 VI. Pregnancy resource centers encourage women to make positive life choices by equipping
16 them with complete and accurate information regarding their pregnancy options and the
17 development of their unborn children.

18 VII. Pregnancy resource centers provide important support and resources for women who
19 choose childbirth over abortion.

20 3 New Chapter; Pregnancy Resource Centers. Amend RSA by inserting after chapter 332-N the
21 following new chapter:

22 CHAPTER 332-O

23 PREGNANCY RESOURCE CENTERS

24 332-O:1 Definitions. In this chapter:

25 I. "Abortion" shall have the definition set provided in RSA 132:32, I.

26 II. "Chemical abortion" means the use or prescription of any drug or chemical for the
27 purpose of inducing an abortion, and shall include mifepristone.

28 III. "Contraception" means the use of any natural or artificial means to prevent the
29 fertilization of a human ovum.

1 IV. "Pregnancy resource center" means a private nonprofit facility that provides pregnancy
2 counseling, material support, or medical care to pregnant women but does not perform abortions or
3 make referrals to abortion providers.

4 332-O:2 Restrictions on State Interference. This state, any agency or subdivision thereof, or any
5 municipality, shall not, through the adoption or enactment of any law, ordinance, policy, or similar
6 measure:

7 I. Require a pregnancy resource center to offer or perform abortions.

8 II. Require a pregnancy resource center to offer, provide, or distribute chemical abortion
9 drugs or contraception.

10 III. Require a pregnancy resource center to refer for abortion, chemical abortion drugs, or
11 contraception.

12 IV. Require a pregnancy resource center to counsel in favor of abortion, chemical abortion
13 drugs, or contraception.

14 V. Require a pregnancy resource center to post any advertisement, sign, flyer, or similar
15 material that promotes or provides information about obtaining an abortion, chemical abortion
16 drugs, or contraception.

17 VI. Prohibit a pregnancy resource center from providing information, care, counseling,
18 classes, or other services related to pregnancy, childbirth, or parenting because the center does not
19 perform, refer, or counsel in favor of abortion, chemical abortion drugs, or contraception.

20 VII. Prohibit a pregnancy resource center from providing pre-natal and post-natal resources
21 such as diapers, baby clothes, baby furniture, formula, and similar items because the center does not
22 perform, refer, or counsel in favor of abortion, chemical abortion drugs, or contraception.

23 VIII. Prohibit a medical pregnancy resource center from providing medical testing,
24 counseling, and care related to pregnancy or childbirth because the center does not perform, refer, or
25 counsel in favor of abortion, chemical abortion drugs, or contraception.

26 IX. Prohibit a medical pregnancy resource center from providing any pregnancy-related care
27 or treatment, including care or treatment that may reverse the effects of chemical abortion drugs by
28 a qualified medical person, including a physician, physician associate, or advanced practice
29 registered nurse, or referring a client to such qualified medical personnel for such treatment.

30 X. Interfere with a pregnancy resource center's staffing or hiring decisions by requiring it to
31 interview, hire, or continue to employ any person who does not affirm the center's mission statement
32 or agree to comply with the center's ethics and operating procedures.

33 332-O:3 Enforcement. A pregnancy resource center, or any party aggrieved by a violation of this
34 chapter, may commence a civil action for injunctive relief, monetary damages, reasonable attorneys'
35 fees, and court costs against the state, any agency or subdivision thereof, or the municipality in
36 violation of this chapter.

1 332-O:4 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or
2 circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the
3 chapter which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
4 provisions of this chapter are declared to be severable.

5 4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2027.
