STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-Six

AN ACT relative to electric aggregation plans.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Subparagraph; Revolving Funds. Amend RSA 31:95-h, I by inserting after subparagraph
2 (g) the following new subparagraph:

3 (h) Facilitating the provision of energy services pursuant to the approved electric
4 aggregation plan under RSA 53-E, provided that no funds raised from local taxes shall be used for
5 such purposes.

6 2 Powers and Duties of Towns; Miscellaneous; Revolving Funds. Amend RSA 31:95-h, I(f)-(g) to
7 read as follows:

8 (f) Financing of energy conservation and efficiency and clean energy improvements by
9 participating property owners in an energy efficiency and clean energy district established pursuant
10 to RSA 53-F; ~~[or]~~

11 (g) Facilitating transactions relative to municipal group net metering~~[-];~~ **or**

12 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
