AN ACT establishing a special veterans license plate and creating a fund and administrative programs from the proceeds of the sale of such plates and establishing the New Hampshire first for veterans program and authority.

AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill authorizes a special veterans license plate and establishes a fund and administrative programs from the proceeds of the sale of such plates.

This bill also establishes the first for veterans program, a program designed to attract, retain, and support veterans in the state.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-Six

AN ACT establishing a special veterans license plate and creating a fund and administrative programs from the proceeds of the sale of such plates and establishing the New Hampshire first for veterans program and authority.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Motor Vehicles; Certificates of Title and Registration of Vehicles; Conservation Number Plate
2 Fund. Amend the introductory paragraph of RSA 261:97-b, I to read as follows:

3 I. There is hereby established a conservation number plate fund under the administration of
4 the commissioner of safety. The fund shall be used for the promotion, protection, and investment in
5 the state's natural, cultural, and historic resources. The fund shall be nonlapsing **and continually**
6 **appropriated**. The commissioner of safety shall distribute the funds annually on August 1, except
7 as provided in paragraph I-a, as follows: \$5,000 of every \$100,000 received, up to a total of \$50,000,
8 shall be distributed to the department of transportation for the expanded wild flower establishment
9 program for use in planting lilacs and native wild flowers; \$1 for every new, renewal, and transfer of
10 registration, up to a total of \$50,000, shall be placed in a nonlapsing account for use by the
11 department of natural and cultural resources to promote the conservation number plate program;
12 the remainder shall be distributed as follows:

13 2 Motor Vehicles; Certificates of Title and Registration of Vehicles; Use of Funds. Amend RSA
14 261:97-c, VII to read as follows:

15 VII. Any funds transferred from the conservation number plate fund which remain
16 unexpended at the end of the fiscal year shall be nonlapsing **and continually appropriated**.

17 3 New Subdivision; Special Veteran Number Plates and Special Veteran Number Plate Fund.
18 Amend RSA 261 by inserting after section 97-f the following new subdivision:

19 Special Veteran Number Plates and Special Veteran Number Plate Fund

20 261:97-g Special Veteran Number Plates.

21 I. The director is hereby authorized to issue special New Hampshire first for veterans
22 number plates, in lieu of other number plates. The design of these special plates shall be determined
23 as provided in RSA 261:97-k. The plates shall retain the "live free or die" logo. Such plates shall be
24 issued only upon application and upon payment of a \$60 fee that shall be in addition to the regular
25 motor vehicle registration fee and any other number plate fees otherwise required.

26 II. The commissioner is also authorized to issue vanity New Hampshire first for veterans
27 number plates. The fee for any such vanity New Hampshire first for veterans number plate shall be
28 the fee as provided in paragraph I, in addition to the fees for vanity plates which are otherwise

1 established by law. The vanity plate portion of the fee shall be distributed as provided in RSA
2 261:89 and RSA 263:52.

3 III. Plates shall be renewed on an annual basis for \$30 per set, which shall be in addition to
4 the regular motor vehicle registration fee and any other number plate fees otherwise required. Of
5 this sum, the department shall retain an amount as is necessary to recover production and
6 administrative costs as approved by the fiscal committee of the general court. The remaining funds
7 shall be paid to the state treasurer and distributed as provided in RSA 261:97-h. The cost of
8 replacement number plates shall be identical to the cost of initial number plates and the revenue
9 from replacement number plates shall be distributed in the same manner as revenue derived from
10 initial number plates.

11 IV. A person who qualifies for special number plates pursuant to this section may be issued
12 an additional plate for a motorcycle.

13 261:97-h New Hampshire First for Veterans Number Plate Fund.

14 I. There is hereby established a New Hampshire first for veterans number plate fund under
15 the administration of the commissioner of safety. The fund shall be used to promote the general
16 welfare of the state's veterans, service members and their families by providing quality services.
17 The fund shall be nonlapsing and continually appropriated. The commissioner of safety shall
18 distribute the funds annually on August 1 as follows: \$1 for every new, renewal, and transfer of
19 registration, up to a total of \$50,000, shall be placed in a nonlapsing account for use by the
20 department of military affairs and veteran services to promote the New Hampshire first for veterans
21 number plate program; the remainder shall be provided to the New Hampshire first for veterans
22 fund and distributed based on designated programs and initiatives prioritized by the governor and
23 the state veterans council in order to promote the well being of veterans, service members, and their
24 families.

25 II. Each department and commission receiving funding from the New Hampshire first for
26 veterans number plate fund shall establish a line item in their budget. Moneys received from the
27 New Hampshire first for veterans number plate fund shall be in addition to any other sums
28 appropriated and shall not replace base funding received by any of these departments or
29 commissions through the budget process.

30 261:97-i Use of Funds. The moneys in the fund shall be distributed as provided in RSA 261:97-
31 h. The proceeds shall be used as follows:

32 I. The funds transferred to the department of military affairs and veteran services shall be
33 used to promote the general welfare of the state's veterans, service members, and their families by
34 providing quality services for:

35 (a) Attracting and retaining veterans to the state, including transitioning service
36 members to relocate to the state through raising awareness of the state's veteran-friendly advocacy,
37 policies, and laws, making veteran employment support available, improving focus on veteran well-

1 being, creating strategic messaging and transition assistance programs, and reinforcing critical
2 veteran, service member, and family programs and initiatives.

3 (b) Military skills transfer, licensing, training, and certification programs, including
4 collaboration programs with the office of professional licensure and certification.

5 (c) Rewarding and gainful employment through collaborations with New Hampshire
6 veteran-friendly businesses, organizations, colleges, and schools that honor, fortify, empower, and
7 positively impact the lives of veterans, service members, and their families.

8 (d) Promoting the well being and mental and physical health of veterans, including:

9 (1) Taking actions contributing to an increased enrollment of veterans with the U.S.
10 Department of Veterans Affairs.

11 (2) Participating in the ask the question campaign .

12 (3) Participating in the veterans' freedom to smile initiative.

13 (4) Participating in regional and statewide veteran suicide prevention coalitions.

14 (e) Programs and initiatives that contribute to ending veteran homelessness in New
15 Hampshire.

16 (f) Raising awareness of the GI Bill's educational benefits.

17 (g) Participating in programs and initiatives supporting justice-involved veterans.

18 (h) Participating in programs and initiatives that support the development of a better
19 understanding of the implications and create solutions for an aging veteran demographic in New
20 Hampshire.

21 II. Funds transferred to employment security shall be used to support transitioning service
22 members, veterans, and their spouses find meaningful employment.

23 III. Funds transferred to the department of administrative services shall be used to support
24 friendly programs and initiatives across state agencies that benefit veterans, their spouses, and
25 transitioning service members.

26 IV. Funds transferred to the department of business and economic affairs shall be used in
27 support of attracting and retaining veterans to New Hampshire.

28 V. Funds transferred to the department of safety shall be used for administering the New
29 Hampshire first for veterans program.

30 VI. Funds transferred to the department of health and human services shall be used in
31 support of promoting veteran, service members and family members, including physical and mental
32 health, suicide prevention, substance use disorder, housing stability, and age friendly services and
33 support.

34 VII. Funds transferred from the New Hampshire first for veterans number plate fund which
35 remain unexpended at the end of the fiscal year shall be nonlapsing and shall be continually
36 appropriated.

1 VIII. Agencies receiving funds pursuant to this subdivision shall mount signs at funded
2 project sites indicating that the project was funded by the New Hampshire first for veterans number
3 plate program. This requirement may be waived in the case of environmentally sensitive projects
4 where signage could be detrimental to the success of the project.

5 261:97-j Plate Use. Plates issued under this subdivision may be used on passenger motor
6 vehicles and recreation vehicles.

7 261:97-k New Hampshire First for Veterans Number Plate Advisory Commission.

8 I. There is established a New Hampshire first for veterans number plate advisory
9 commission to attract and retain veterans in New Hampshire and perform other tangential duties.

10 II. Notwithstanding RSA 14:49, II, the members of the commission shall be as follows:

11 (a) Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house
12 of representatives.

13 (b) Two members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.

14 (c) The commissioner of the department of military affairs and veteran services, or
15 designee.

16 (b) The commissioner of employment security, or designee.

17 (c) The commissioner of the department of safety, or designee.

18 (d) The commissioner of the department of business and economic affairs, or designee.

19 III. Legislative members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when
20 attending to the duties of the commission.

21 IV. The commission shall:

22 (a) Determine plate designs, with final approval of a design being approved by the
23 commissioner of the department of military affairs and veteran services. The commissioner of the
24 department of safety shall establish a numbering system and method of distribution.

25 (b) Register plate designs with the secretary of state.

26 (c) Oversee signage of projects funded pursuant to this subdivision.

27 V. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The
28 committee chairperson shall appoint a secretary from the New Hampshire department of military
29 and veterans affairs to keep a detailed record of all commission proceedings. The first meeting of the
30 commission shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting of the commission
31 shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. The commission shall meet at least
32 once annually. Four members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.

33 VI. The commission shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed
34 legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house
35 clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1.

36 261:97-l Agency Reports.

1 I. The department of military affairs and veteran services, employment security, the
2 department of business and economic affairs, and the department of safety shall submit an annual
3 report to the New Hampshire first for veterans number plate advisory commission on or before
4 October 1. The commission chairperson shall compile the reports as a unified report and submit the
5 unified report to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house
6 clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before December 31.

7 II. The unified report shall contain the following:

8 (a) A report from the department of safety indicating:

9 (1) The total number of New Hampshire first for veterans number plates sold during
10 the preceding year, including the number of initial plates and the number of renewals.

11 (2) The gross revenue derived from the sale of plates.

12 (3) The amount retained by the department of safety to cover its administrative
13 costs of administering programs under this subdivision.

14 (4) The amount paid to the state treasurer for deposit into the New Hampshire First
15 for veterans number plate fund during the preceding fiscal year.

16 (b) A report from the other 3 agencies receiving proceeds pursuant to this subdivision
17 indicating:

18 (1) The amount of proceeds received pursuant to this subdivision;

19 (2) The total amount of funds expended;

20 (3) Any accomplishments achieved as a result of this subdivision during the
21 preceding fiscal year.

22 (4) An outline of the projects and programs to be conducted in the ensuing fiscal year
23 with proceeds from this subdivision.

24 4 New Subdivision; First for Veterans Program. Amend RSA 110-B by inserting after section 91
25 the following new subdivision:

26 First for Veterans Program

27 110-B:92 Declaration of Purpose. The general court declares it to be the purpose of this
28 subdivision to:

29 I. Maintain the state's ability to attract and retain veterans to New Hampshire and attain
30 and maintain a position as the most veteran-friendly state.

31 II. Acknowledge and address demand signals for critical resources, service, and support.

32 III. Recognize the gaps and the importance of public and private partnerships to identify,
33 develop, and resource solutions to facilitate overcoming barriers to veterans, service members and
34 their families.

35 IV. Learn, adapt, seek, and resource new and more transformational concepts that raise
36 awareness of the state's veteran-friendly advocacy, policy, and laws.

37 V. Develop veteran employment support and improve focus on veteran well-being.

1 VI. Provide strategic messaging and transition assistance programs and reinforce critical
2 gaps, including mental health care access, suicide prevention, substance use disorder, physical well
3 being, employment, and housing stability.

4 110-B:93 Definitions. In this subdivision:

5 I. "Authority" means the New Hampshire first for veterans authority.

6 II. "Board" means the board of directors of the New Hampshire first for veterans authority.

7 III. "Grant obligations" means the legal obligation arising from the use of program funds.

8 110-B:94 New Hampshire First for Veterans Program Established.

9 I. There is hereby established the New Hampshire first for veterans program. The program
10 shall provide funding to promote the general welfare of the state's veterans, service members and
11 their families by providing quality services.

12 II. The program will prioritize efforts that:

13 (a) Contribute to ending veteran homelessness in New Hampshire;

14 (b) Attract and retain veterans to New Hampshire and match their unique skills with
15 veteran-friendly businesses and organizations and provide them with employment support;

16 (c) Improve access to physical and mental health care, suicide prevention measures, oral
17 health care options, and substance use disorder treatment;

18 (d) Support military skills transfer, training, and certification; and

19 (e) Address a broad range of educational opportunities, including institutions of higher
20 learning, on-the-job training, and apprenticeships and initiatives focused on the trades.

21 110-B:95 New Hampshire First For Veterans Authority.

22 I. There is hereby established the New Hampshire first for veterans authority, which shall
23 act as a both a public and private entity. The authority shall be constituted as a public
24 instrumentality of the state. The authority and power conferred by this subdivision shall be deemed
25 and held to be the performance of public and essential governmental functions. The authority shall
26 be a nonprofit corporation organized under RSA 292.

27 II. The authority shall be governed by a board of directors composed of 11 members. A
28 chairperson shall be elected from among the members.

29 III. Board members shall be as follows:

30 (a) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.

31 (b) Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house
32 of representatives.

33 (c) Five members of the veterans council, appointed by the governor.

34 (d) The commissioner of the department of military affairs and veteran services, or
35 designee.

36 (e) The chair of the New Hampshire state veterans advisory committee, or designee.

1 (f) A member of the New Hampshire military leadership team, appointed by the
2 adjutant general.

3 IV.(a) The terms of state agency members, member of the senate, and members of the house
4 of representatives shall be coterminous with their respective terms in office.

5 (b) Members appointed by the governor may be removed from office for cause by the
6 governor. Cause for removal shall include incapacity or failure to perform a member's duties.
7 Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term of the office in the same manner as the original
8 appointment. Legislative members shall be entitled to mileage reimbursement at the legislative
9 rate.

10 V. Five members shall constitute a quorum. Decisions shall be made by a majority of those
11 present and voting. The board shall meet quarterly and at such other times as may be deemed
12 necessary by the chairperson.

13 VI. Board members shall not be subject to civil liability for acts performed in accordance
14 with their duties under this subdivision.

15 110-B:96 Powers and Duties of the Authority. The authority shall have all the powers necessary
16 and convenient to carry out and effectuate the purposes and provisions of this subdivision and shall:

17 I. Adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and the conduct of its business.

18 II. Adopt criteria and guidelines for:

19 (a) The acquisition of resource assets;

20 (b) The restoration or rehabilitation of cultural and historical buildings or structures;

21 and

22 (c) The stewardship and monitoring of resource assets on which program funds are
23 expended.

24 III. Adopt policies deemed important or necessary to carry out the purposes of this
25 subdivision.

26 IV. Oversee and direct the expenditure of funds deposited in the New Hampshire first for
27 veterans fund in accordance with the purposes of this subdivision, which shall include the authority
28 to draw upon funds for program purposes and for administrative costs of the program.

29 V. Make and execute contracts for services necessary to carry out the purposes of this
30 subdivision.

31 VI. Enforce grant obligations through contract, acceptance of rights to enforcement, or other
32 legal actions as necessary to carry out the purposes of this subdivision.

33 VII. Prepare an annual report to be presented and filed, by no later than December 1, to the
34 president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the governor, and the state
35 library. The report shall detail the activities and administrative costs of the authority, as well as a
36 complete financial accounting of the funds established under RSA 110-B:99 and 110-B:100. The

1 report shall also include a historical summary of the program's activities to date. A copy of the
2 report shall be made available by the authority to any interested person.

3 VIII. Conduct an independent audit by a certified public accountant of its books and
4 accounts each fiscal year.

5 IX. Should the authority deem it appropriate:

6 (a) Adopt an official seal.

7 (b) Maintain an office and hire staff.

8 (c) Apply for, or accept from any source, gifts and donations of:

9 (1) Money, including money from appropriate fundraising activities;

10 (2) Labor, equipment, and supplies;

11 (3) Federal, local, private, and other matching funds and incentives; and

12 (4) Other assets to be deposited in the fund that may aid the authority in the
13 conduct of its affairs.

14 (d) Employ or retain, as independent contractors attorneys, accountants, and other
15 advisors, consultants, or agents as may be necessary without regard to any personnel or civil service
16 law of the state to prescribe their duties and qualifications, and to fix and pay their compensation, if
17 any.

18 (e) Appoint qualified individuals to serve as unpaid volunteers under such terms and
19 conditions as deemed necessary. Said volunteers or advisors may be paid a stipend and/or
20 reimbursed for any incidental expenses determined by the authority to be necessary and incurred
21 while performing the business of the authority.

22 110-B:97 Executive Director. The board of directors shall nominate one for appointment by the
23 governor to serve as an executive director. The executive director shall serve a term of 5 years, with
24 reappointment or a vacancy to be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. At the
25 request of the board, the governor may remove the executive director for cause. The chairperson of
26 the authority shall not serve concurrently as the executive director. The executive director shall:

27 I. Coordinate the activities of state agencies directly involved with the administration of the
28 program in accordance with this subdivision.

29 II. Evaluate the eligible resources proposed for protection or restoration under this program,
30 and determine if these resources meet the criteria of the program, subsequent to instruction by the
31 board.

32 III. At the direction of the board, administer the affairs of the program and be directly
33 responsible for executing all policies of the board.

34 110-B:98 Status of Employees.

35 I. The authority may hire, fix, and pay compensation, prescribe duties and qualifications,
36 and establish personnel policies without regard to any personnel or civil service law or personnel or
37 civil service rule of the state. The employees of the authority shall not be classified employees of the

1 state within the meaning of RSA 21-I:49. Any individual employed by the authority shall be deemed
2 an employee at will and shall serve at the pleasure of the authority.

3 II. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph I, any individual employed by the authority
4 whose employment calls for 30 hours or more work in a normal calendar week, and whose position is
5 anticipated to have a duration of 6 months or more, shall be entitled to elect to receive such health,
6 dental, life insurance, deferred compensation, and retirement benefits as are afforded to classified
7 employees of the state provided, however, that the election is made in writing within 30 days of the
8 start of employment. Upon election by such individual, the authority shall pay from its revenues the
9 state's share of such benefits. Any remaining costs of health, dental, life insurance, deferred
10 compensation, and retirement benefits which an individual elects to receive pursuant to this section,
11 shall be withheld from such individual's salary as a payroll deduction. Written notice of the
12 availability of these benefit options shall be provided to each individual upon employment by the
13 authority.

14 110-B:99 Trust Fund Established; Administration.

15 I. There is established in the office of the state treasurer the New Hampshire first for
16 veterans trust fund. Moneys in the fund and any interest earned on the fund shall only be used for
17 the purpose of this subdivision. The trust fund shall be non-lapsing interest bearing funds and shall
18 be continually appropriated to the department of military affairs and veterans services.

19 II. The state treasurer shall invest the sums deposited in the fund in a prudent manner
20 consistent with the purposes of this subdivision. Interest earned on moneys in the fund shall accrue
21 to the fund to the extent allowed under law.

22 III. No funds of any state agency shall be transferred to the trust fund without authorization
23 from the general court. Federal funds accepted by the joint fiscal committee or governor for purposes
24 similar to those of this subdivision may be deposited in the trust fund.

25 110-B:100 Administrative Fund.

26 I. There is established in the authority a separate fund to be known as the first for veterans
27 administrative fund. The total revenues generated to the administrative fund from this source shall
28 not exceed \$200,000 for each fiscal year. Any revenue generated from this source in excess of the
29 \$200,000 maximum per year shall be credited by the New Hampshire first for veterans trust fund in
30 RSA 110-B:99. In its annual report, the authority shall include the amount of revenues exceeding
31 the maximum which are credited to the New Hampshire first for veterans trust fund.

32 II. All sums so credited shall be appropriated to the authority for the following purposes:

33 (a) To pay the costs of administering and operating the authority, including all wages,
34 salaries, benefits, and other expenses authorized by the board or the executive director. The
35 authority may enter into a contract or agreement for provision of services to withhold on a monthly
36 basis all payroll and benefit costs for employees.

1 (b) For the payment of all expenses incident to the management and operation of the
2 authority consistent with its statutory purpose and as the board or the executive director may
3 determine.

4 III. This fund shall constitute a continuing appropriation for the benefit of the authority.
5 Any amount remaining to the credit of the authority at the close of any fiscal year, and any interest
6 accrued, shall be nonlapsing and shall be carried over and credited to the fund for the succeeding
7 year.

8 110-B:101 Program Administration; Matching Funds.

9 I. The authority shall distribute funds to further the purposes of this subdivision only to
10 eligible applicants. Eligible applicants shall include:

11 (a) Municipalities or other political subdivisions of the state; and

12 (b) Publicly-supported nonprofit corporations exempt from federal income taxation
13 under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code.

14 II. Other parties wishing to participate in the program may partner with one or more
15 eligible applicants. At the option of eligible applicants and with the approval of the board, state
16 agencies may hold rights in resource assets acquired through the program by eligible applicants.
17 The applicant must demonstrate the commitment of the owner of the assets to participate in the
18 proposed action.

19 III. Financial assistance to eligible applicants shall be provided through grants, block
20 grants, and loans. Up to 50 percent of financial assistance provided each year may be provided
21 through loans. Principal and interest paid on such loans shall be deposited in the New Hampshire
22 first for veterans number plate fund established in RSA 261:97-h. Financial assistance may only be
23 expended on eligible resources for the following purposes:

24 (a) Ending veteran homelessness in New Hampshire;

25 (b) Attracting and retaining veterans to New Hampshire;

26 (c) Matching veteran skills with workforce development needs;

27 (d) Businesses and organizations that honor and positively impact veterans, service
28 members, and their families;

29 (e) Employment support;

30 (f) Improving access to physical and mental health care;

31 (g) Suicide prevention measures;

32 (h) Providing oral health care options;

33 (i) Substance use disorder treatment;

34 (j) Support military skills transfer, training, and certification; or

35 (k) Addressing a range of educational opportunities including institutes of higher
36 learning, on the job training, apprenticeships and initiatives focused on the trades.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill authorizes a special veterans license plate and establishes new entities, programs, and dedicated funds. Sections of this bill will be discussed separately below, with fiscal impact information at the end:

Sections 1 and 2

These sections add “continually appropriated” in two areas, related to the Conservation Number Plate Fund. This would permit available funds to be expended, without necessitating spending authority in the state operating budget (or any other legislation. These sections have no direct fiscal impact.

Section 3

This section establishes the New Hampshire First for Veterans specialty license plate program and creates the New Hampshire First for Veterans Number Plate Fund. The Department of Safety is authorized to issue specialty plates, including vanity plates and additional motorcycle plates, and to retain sufficient revenue from plate fees to recover production and administrative

costs, subject to Fiscal Committee approval. Remaining revenues, including those generated from plate sales, renewals, replacements, and any royalties from commercial use of the plate design, are to be deposited into the newly established fund.

The fund is designated as nonlapsing, and continually appropriated, and is to be distributed annually to support programs benefiting veterans, service members, and their families. This bill identifies multiple state agencies (Department of Military Affairs and Veterans Services, Department of Administrative Services, Department of Business and Economic Affairs, Department of Health and Human Services, and New Hampshire Employment Security) eligible to receive funding for specified initiatives, including veteran employment support, health and wellness programs, workforce training, and program administration. The bill also establishes an advisory commission to oversee plate design, monitor funded initiatives, and coordinate reporting requirements. It is unknown if the participating agencies will be able to administer these responsibilities within existing operational structures. The amount of revenue generated will depend on demand for specialty plates.

Section 4

This section establishes the New Hampshire First for Veterans Program and creates the New Hampshire First for Veterans Authority as a public instrumentality of the state organized as a nonprofit corporation. The authority is governed by a board of directors and is granted broad powers to administer program funds, enter into contracts, award grants and loans, hire staff, and accept public and private funding. The program is intended to support initiatives related to veteran housing stability, employment, workforce training, health care access, education, and other services designed to attract and retain veterans in the state.

The section also establishes a dedicated fund, as well as a separate administrative fund, to support operating expenses of the authority, subject to an annual revenue cap. Financial assistance may be provided to municipalities and qualifying nonprofit organizations, with up to 50 percent of assistance authorized in the form of loans. The authority is required to conduct annual independent audits and submit detailed reports on program activities and expenditures.

Since the program funding is expected to be derived from specialty plate revenues, donations, federal funds, and other non-general fund sources, any fiscal impact to the state will depend on the level of participation and revenue generation. Additional administrative costs may be incurred if the authority hires staff or expands program operations; however, these costs are intended to be supported by dedicated program revenues rather than general fund appropriations.

Section 5

This section added the dedicated funds discussed above to RSA 6:12.

Potential Fiscal Impacts

To implement the new plate type, the Division of Motor Vehicles states it would incur annual costs of approximately \$50,000 beginning in FY 2027, based on a \$5 per plate cost and an estimated 5,000 plate sets (10,000 plates) distributed per year. At a fee of \$30 per set, the Department estimates revenue of \$150,000 per year.

The Department of Military Affairs and Veterans Services states it would need one accountant/auditor position to implement this bill, at a cost of \$105,000 in FY 2027, \$106,000 in FY 2028, and \$112,000 in FY 2029. The Department assumes the position would be funded with general funds.

This bill may also have an indeterminable impact on the Department of Administrative Services, Department of Business and Economic Affairs, and New Hampshire Employment Security, to the extent program funds are available and allocated to each respective agency.

The bill does not impose any mandates or direct costs on county or local governments. However, municipalities and other political subdivisions could experience an indeterminable increase in revenue or expenditures, to the extent they apply for and receive grants or loans under the New Hampshire First for Veterans Program.
