House Bill 59-FN establishes felony-level offenses for assaults upon first responders and law enforcement officers, which may constitute prima facie evidence for detention. To knowingly cause serious bodily harm, or bodily harm upon first responders or law enforcement shall be first degree assault and second-degree assault, respectively. The Committee recommends re-referral to contemplate impacts on bail and corrections.
