SENATE BILL **273-FN**

AN ACT relative to motorist duties when approaching highway emergencies involving a stopped or standing vehicle.

ANALYSIS

This bill adds stopped or standing vehicles as highway emergencies requiring approaching drivers to give a wide berth.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Five

AN ACT relative to motorist duties when approaching highway emergencies involving a stopped or standing vehicle.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Short Title. This act shall be known as "Sherrill's Law".

2 2 Motorist Duties; Approaching Stopped or Standing Vehicles. Amend RSA 265:37-a, I to read
3 as follows:

4 I. When in or approaching an incident involving a fire, collision, disaster, utility construction
5 or maintenance, or other emergency resulting in partial or complete blockage of a highway, or a
6 location where a police officer has made a traffic stop, ***or a stopped or standing vehicle***
7 ***displaying warning signals, including vehicle hazard warning lights, road flares, traffic***
8 ***cones, caution signs, or any nonvehicular warning signs***, every driver other than the driver of
9 an emergency response vehicle, shall:

10 (a) Maintain a reduced speed ***and if practical give a wide berth, without***
11 ***endangering oncoming traffic, to public safety personnel, any persons in the roadway, and***
12 ***vehicles displaying blue, red, or amber emergency, warning lights, or a stopped or standing***
13 ***vehicle.***

14 (b) Obey the directions of any authorized person directing traffic and of all applicable
15 emergency signals and traffic control devices.

16 (c) Vacate as soon as possible any lane wholly or partially blocked.

17 ~~[(d) Give a wide berth, without endangering oncoming traffic, to public safety personnel,~~
18 ~~any persons in the roadway, and vehicles displaying blue, red, or amber emergency or warning~~
19 ~~lights.]~~

20 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
