

1 Committee of Conference Report on SB 369-FN, requiring public schools to include drug and alcohol

4 Recommendation:

5 That the Senate recede from its position of nonconcurrence with the House amendment, and
6 concur with the House amendment, and

7 That the Senate and House adopt the following new amendment to the bill as amended by the
8 House, and pass the bill as so amended:

10 Amend the bill by replacing section 1 with the following:

11
12 1 New Section; School Boards; Drug and Alcohol Education. Amend RSA 189 by inserting after
13 section 11-c the following new section:

14 189:11-d Drug and Alcohol Education.

15 I. Each public school in the state, as part of the school board-approved kindergarten
16 through grade 12 health education program, shall provide age and developmentally appropriate
17 drug and alcohol education to pupils based upon the needs of the pupils and the community. The
18 school board may authorize the use of an evidence-based prevention program.

19 II. School boards shall develop policies authorizing school district personnel to provide
20 pupils, parents, and legal guardians with information and resources relative to existing drug and
21 alcohol counseling and treatment for pupils. Nothing in this section shall require a school district to
22 add additional programs or services, but only to provide information about available programs and
23 services.
