ANALYSIS

This bill provides that ambulance service providers are essential service providers for purposes of emergency management at the state and local level.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Five

AN ACT relative to the designation of emergency medical services performed by ambulance service providers as essential services.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Homeland Security and Emergency Management; Definition of Local Organization for
2 Emergency Management; Ambulance Service Providers Included. Amend RSA 21-P:35, VI to read as
3 follows:

4 VI. "Local organization for emergency management" means an organization created in
5 accordance with the provisions of this subdivision by state, county, or local authority to perform local
6 emergency management functions, which may direct the utilization of first responders, ***including***
7 ***the provision of emergency medical services by ambulance service providers.***

8 2 Homeland Security and Emergency Management; Definition of First Responders; Ambulance
9 Service Providers Included. Amend RSA 21-P:35, IX to read as follows:

10 IX. "First responders" means state, county, and local governmental and nongovernmental
11 emergency public safety fire, law enforcement, public safety telecommunications or dispatcher,
12 emergency response, emergency medical services providers including ***ambulance service***
13 ***providers***, hospital emergency facilities, emergency management, public health, clinical care, public
14 works, and other skilled and essential support personnel and volunteers, such as equipment
15 operators, and individuals serving on state and community emergency response teams, medical
16 reserve corps, disaster animal and health professional response teams that provide immediate
17 support services necessary to perform emergency management functions. First responders are
18 essential services providers.

19 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill provides that ambulance service providers are essential service providers for purposes of emergency management at the state and local level. The Department of Safety states this bill could result in increased costs to county and local governments during required activation of ambulance services. Furthermore, the New Hampshire Association of Counties states that if the intent of this bill is to require county governments to provide ambulance services, there would be an increase to county expenditures (currently, Cheshire County is the only county in the state to provide ambulance services).

AGENCIES CONTACTED:

Department of Safety, New Hampshire Association of Counties, and New Hampshire Municipal Association
