SENATE BILL **460-FN**

AN ACT relative to the offense of loitering or prowling.

COMMITTEE: Judiciary

ANALYSIS

This bill prohibits certain registered offenders who are required to register due to a sexual offense against a child under 13 years of age from appearing within 1,000 feet of certain locations under circumstances that would warrant alarm.

This bill is a request of the department of safety.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-Six

AN ACT relative to the offense of loitering or prowling.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Paragraph; Loitering or Prowling. Amend RSA 644:6 by inserting after paragraph I the
2 following new paragraph:

3 I-a. A person commits a violation if he or she, while being required to register as a tier II or
4 tier III offender under RSA 651-B as a result of a sexual offense against a child under 13 years of
5 age, knowingly appears within 1,000 feet of any of the following places under circumstances that
6 warrant alarm for the safety of persons in the vicinity:

7 (a) Any childcare facility.

8 (b) Any church.

9 (c) Any school.

10 (d) Any area where a reasonable person would know that minor children congregate.

11 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2027.
