HOUSE BILL **1224**

AN ACT relative to the default budget for official ballot town meetings.

ANALYSIS

This bill amends the definition of default budget to include salary and benefit reductions of vacant positions, subject to an exception.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ACT relative to the default budget for official ballot town meetings.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Use of an Official Ballot; Definition of Default Budget. RSA 40:13, IX(b) is repealed and
2 reenacted to read as follows:

3 (b) "Default budget" as used in this subdivision means the amount of the same
4 appropriations as contained in the operating budget authorized for the previous year, reduced and
5 increased as the case may be, by debt service, contracts, and other obligations previously incurred by
6 law or mandated by law, and reduced by one-time expenditures contained in the operating budget,
7 by salaries and benefits of positions that have been eliminated in the proposed budget, by salaries
8 and benefits of positions that were vacant before the previous year's budget was approved and have
9 remained vacant, and reflecting the actual salary and benefits of filled positions as of the public
10 hearing for the proposed budget excluding any increases subsequent to the authorization of the
11 previous year's operating budget. For the purposes of this paragraph, one-time expenditures shall
12 be appropriations not likely to recur in the succeeding budget, and eliminated positions shall not
13 include vacant positions under recruitment unless vacant before the previous year's approved budget
14 was approved, as determined by the governing body of the local political subdivision, unless the
15 provisions of RSA 40:14-b are adopted. Any budget line item in the operating budget authorized for
16 the previous year from which a transfer was made for any one-time expenditures shall be reduced by
17 the amount of the transfer in the default budget. In calculating the default budget amount, the
18 governing body, or the budget committee if the provisions of RSA 40:14-b are adopted, shall follow
19 the statutory formula which may result in a higher or lower amount than the proposed operating
20 budget.

21 2 New Subparagraph; Use of Official Ballot; Exception for Certain Vacant Positions. Amend
22 RSA 40:13, IX by inserting after subparagraph (c) the following new subparagraph:

23 (d) The default budget may contain funding for vacant public safety positions under
24 recruitment and vacant before the previous year's budget was approved if such positions were in the
25 previous year's approved budget and are listed as separate line items in the budget. Such line items
26 shall only be expended for the designated public safety positions, and any unexpended funds in such
27 line items shall not be transferred to any other line item in the budget and shall be used to reduce
28 local taxes for the current fiscal year. Public safety positions shall include any positions for law
29 enforcement, fire protection, emergency medical services, emergency management, and town
30 positions with snow removal duties.

1 3 Use of an Official Ballot; Calculation of the Default Budget. Amend RSA 40:13, XI(a)(3) to
2 read as follows:

3 (3) One-time expenditures, ***including reductions to line items for transfers***
4 ***made for one-time expenditures***, as defined under subparagraph IX(b); and

5 4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2027.
