This resolution urges the prohibition of the intentional release of polluting emissions, including cloud seeding and weather modification, to preserve the atmosphere of New Hampshire.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

A RESOLUTION urging the prohibition of the intentional release of polluting emissions, including cloud seeding and weather modification, to preserve the atmosphere of New Hampshire.

1 Whereas, many atmospheric activities such as weather modification, stratospheric aerosol
2 injection (SAI), solar radiation modification (SRM), and other forms of geoengineering, involving the
3 intentional release of polluting emissions, harm human health and safety, the environment,
4 agriculture, wildlife, aviation, state security, and the economy of the state of New Hampshire; and

5 Whereas, it is the intention of the New Hampshire house of representatives to prohibit the
6 intentional injection, release, or dispersion, by any means, of chemicals, chemical compounds,
7 substances, or apparatus within the borders of this state into the atmosphere with the express
8 purpose of affecting temperature, weather, or the intensity of the sunlight, thereby prohibiting
9 geoengineering (including SAI and SRM) and other intentionally polluting activities in New
10 Hampshire's atmosphere and/or at ground level to preserve the safe, healthful, and peaceful uses of
11 New Hampshire's atmosphere for people, wildlife, and agriculture; and

12 Whereas, due to necessity arising from the federal stance and the potential and ease for enemies,
13 foreign and domestic, to cause harm intentionally, the states' rights, including their authorities, are
14 correctly exerted pursuant to the Tenth Amendment, where federal programs and restrictions have
15 become oppressive or destructive; now, therefore, be it

16 Resolved by the House of Representatives: the house hereby declares that no person shall engage
17 in geoengineering activities, including weather modification, stratospheric aerosol injection, or solar
18 radiation modification involving the intentional release of polluting emissions within the borders of
19 the state of New Hampshire.

20 Let it be further resolved that the commissioner of the department of environmental services
21 shall, within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution, provide notice of this policy to the following
22 entities and shall also create a dedicated page on the department of environmental services' website
23 containing a copy of this resolution and copies of each certified letter sent to the following entities:
