HOUSE BILL ***1766-FN***

AN ACT relative to cruelty to livestock.

SPONSORS: Rep. Comtois, Belk. 7; Rep. J. Aron, Sull. 4; Rep. Bixby, Straf. 13

COMMITTEE: Environment and Agriculture

AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill provides procedures for the potential confiscation of livestock involved in cruelty to animal cases.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-Six

AN ACT relative to cruelty to livestock.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Cruelty to Animals. Amend RSA 644:8, IV(a)(1) to read as follows:

2 IV.(a)(1) Any person charged with animal cruelty under paragraphs III or III-a may have his or her
3 animals, ***except for livestock***, confiscated by the arresting officer. ***The confiscation of livestock shall be***
4 ***governed by paragraph IV-b.***

5 2 Cruelty to Animals. Amend RSA 644:8, IV-a(a) to read as follows:

6 IV-a.(a) Except as provided in subparagraphs (b) and (c) any appropriate law enforcement
7 officer, animal control officer, or officer of a duly licensed humane society may take into temporary
8 protective custody any animal, ***except for livestock, which shall be governed by paragraph IV-b***, when
9 there is probable cause to believe that it has been or is being abused or neglected in violation of
10 paragraphs III or III-a when there is a clear and imminent danger to the animal's health or life and there is
11 not sufficient time to obtain a court order. Such officer shall leave a written notice indicating the type and
12 number of animals taken into protective custody, the name of the officer, the time and date taken, the
13 reason it was taken, the procedure to have the animal returned and any other relevant information. Such
14 notice shall be left at the location where the animal was taken into custody. The officer shall provide for
15 proper care and housing of any animal taken into protective custody under this paragraph. If, after 7 days,
16 the animal has not been returned or claimed, the officer shall petition the municipal or district court
17 seeking either permanent custody or a one-week extension of custody or shall file charges under this
18 section. If a week's extension is granted by the court and after a period of 14 days the animal remains
19 unclaimed, the title and custody of the animal shall rest with the officer on behalf of the officer's
20 department or society. The department or society may dispose of the animal in any lawful and humane
21 manner as if it were the rightful owner. If after 14 days the officer or the officer's department determines
22 that charges should be filed under this section, the officer shall petition the court.

23 3 New Paragraphs; Cruelty to Animals; Livestock. Amend RSA 644:8 by inserting after paragraph IV-
24 a the following new paragraphs:

25 IV-b.(a) Any person charged with cruelty to animals under paragraph III or III-a concerning
26 livestock may have his or her livestock confiscated by the arresting officer. No animal shall be confiscated
27 unless a person is charged under this section, except when there is probable cause to believe the
28 livestock's life is in imminent danger. The investigating officer for a case involving livestock as defined in
29 RSA 427:38, III shall be accompanied by the state veterinarian or designee, to include New Hampshire
30 department of agriculture, markets, and food staff, or a licensed veterinarian, or other qualified staff from
31 an animal shelter facility approved by the state veterinarian, in person or by video, who shall determine

1 whether there is probable cause to believe that the livestock should be confiscated. Livestock confiscated
2 without a warrant where a charge has not been filed shall be returned within 10 days.

3 (b) The department of justice shall develop a form to be distributed to any person charged
4 with cruelty to animals under paragraph III or III-a, concerning livestock. The form shall inform the person
5 of their right to have the confiscated livestock examined by a veterinarian licensed under RSA 332-B,
6 chosen by the person charged, at the person's expense.

7 (c) Courts shall give cases in which livestock have been confiscated by an arresting officer
8 priority on the court calendar, as outlined in RSA 644:8, IV(a)(3).

9 (d) Any person with proof of sole ownership or co-ownership of the livestock confiscated by
10 an arresting officer in a livestock cruelty case and who is not a defendant or party of interest in the criminal
11 case may petition the court for temporary custody of the livestock. The court shall give such person
12 priority for temporary custody of the livestock if the court determines it is in the best interest of the
13 livestock's health, safety, and wellbeing.

14 (e) No custodian of the livestock confiscated under this section shall spay or neuter or
15 otherwise permanently alter the confiscated livestock in his or her custody pending final disposition of the
16 court case unless a treating veterinarian deems such procedure necessary to save the life of the livestock
17 or the owner of the livestock agrees in writing to the procedure or treatment. If the treating veterinarian
18 believes that livestock which has been confiscated is in a state of suffering and that the cost to alleviate
19 the suffering will exceed the amount of allowable reimbursement as set by Agr 3504.01(c)(8), unless the
20 owner pays for the care, the animal shall be euthanized.

21 (f) Upon a person's conviction of cruelty to animals regarding livestock, the court shall
22 dispose of the confiscated livestock in any manner it decides except in a case in which the confiscated
23 livestock is owned or co-owned by persons other than the defendant. If the defendant does not have an
24 ownership interest in the confiscated livestock, the court shall give priority to restoring full ownership rights
25 to any person with proof of ownership if the court determines that such is in the best interest of the
26 livestock's health, safety, and wellbeing. If the confiscated livestock is co-owned by the defendant, the
27 court shall give priority to transferring the defendant's interest in the property to the remaining owner or
28 co-owners equitably if the court determines that such is in the best interest of the livestock's health, safety,
29 and wellbeing.

30 (g) The costs to provide the confiscated livestock with humane care and adequate and
31 necessary veterinary services, if any, incurred in boarding and treating the livestock, pending disposition
32 of the case, and in disposing of the livestock upon a conviction of said person for cruelty to animals
33 regarding livestock, shall be borne by the person so convicted in accordance with rules adopted by the
34 department of agriculture, markets, and food.

35 (h) Any donations raised using the stories or likenesses of the animals in protective custody
36 shall be used to offset the cost of care of such animals.

37 IV-c.(a) Except as provided in RSA 644:8, IV(b), any appropriate law enforcement officer or
38 municipal animal control officer may take into temporary protective custody any livestock when the owner
39 or caretaker is not present and there is probable cause to believe that it has been or is being abused or
40 neglected in violation of paragraphs III or III-a when there is a clear and imminent danger to the livestock's

1 health or life and there is not sufficient time to obtain a court order. Such officer shall leave a written
2 notice indicating the type and number of livestock taken into protective custody, the name of the officer,
3 the time and date taken, the reason it was taken, the procedure to have the livestock returned, and any
4 other relevant information. Such notice shall be left at the location where the livestock was taken into
5 custody. The officer shall provide for proper care and housing of any livestock taken into protective
6 custody under this paragraph. For any livestock confiscated without a warrant where a charge has not
7 been filed, the confiscated livestock shall be returned within 10 days. If, after 10 days, the livestock has
8 not been returned or claimed, the officer shall petition the municipal or district court seeking either
9 permanent custody or a one-week extension of custody or shall file charges under this section. If a
10 week's extension is granted by the court and after a period of 14 days the livestock remains unclaimed,
11 the title and custody of the livestock shall rest with the officer on behalf of the officer's department. The
12 department may dispose of the livestock in any lawful and humane manner as if it were the rightful owner.
13 If after 14 days the officer or the officer's department determines that charges should be filed under this
14 section, the officer shall petition the court. An owner of livestock taken into protective custody shall have
15 the right as referenced in subparagraph IV(b).

16 (b) For purposes of subparagraph (a), the investigating officer for livestock, as defined in
17 RSA 427:38, III, shall be accompanied by the state veterinarian or their designee in person or by video,
18 who shall set the probable cause criteria for taking the livestock.

19 (c) In cases where one or more lactating livestock is confiscated, proof shall be provided by
20 the confiscating party to the attending veterinarian and the owner or caretaker that proper care and
21 facilities shall be provided for adults and offspring. No lactating livestock shall be separated from its non-
22 weaned offspring unless such separation is authorized by a licensed veterinarian.

23 (d) No person, other than the state veterinarian or their designee, or an employee of a
24 government agency with jurisdiction to investigate violations of this section, and who is conducting an
25 investigation under this section, may take part during any investigation into a complaint conducted
26 pursuant to this section. No person who may be called upon to take custody of any livestock seized as a
27 result of a complaint under this section may participate in the decision to seize any livestock. The act of
28 making or forwarding a complaint does not make a person part of an investigation, and does not render
29 that person ineligible to take animals into custody.

30 (e) In order to protect the integrity of complaint investigations an appropriate law enforcement
31 officer shall require any person or their designated agent called upon to take custody of any livestock
32 seized or to assist during any complaint investigation, to sign a binding nondisclosure agreement intended
33 to protect any shared or confidential information against unauthorized use pending final adjudication or
34 dismissal of such complaint; provided that information may be disclosed only to officials with a need to
35 know who are subject to confidentiality obligations.

36 (f) No custodian of livestock in temporary protective custody under this section shall spay or
37 neuter or otherwise permanently alter the confiscated livestock in his or her custody pending final
38 disposition of the court case unless a treating veterinarian deems such procedure necessary to save the
39 life of the livestock or the owner of the livestock agrees in writing to the procedure or treatment. If the
40 treating veterinarian believes that livestock which has been confiscated is in a state of suffering and that

1 the cost to alleviate the suffering will exceed the amount of allowable reimbursement as set by Agr
2 3504.01(c)(8), unless the owner pays for the care or surrenders the animal outright or for care by an
3 animal shelter facility, the animal shall be euthanized.

4 4 Veterinarian Assistant. Amend RSA 644:8, V to read as follows:

5 V. A veterinarian licensed to practice in the state *and the state veterinarian or their designee* shall
6 be held harmless from either criminal or civil liability for any decisions made for services rendered under
7 the provisions of this section or RSA 435:11-16. Such a veterinarian *or designee* is, therefore, under this
8 paragraph, protected from a lawsuit for his *or her* part in an investigation of cruelty to animals.

9 5 State Veterinarian; Powers. Amend RSA 436:8 to read as follows:

10 436:8 Powers. The state veterinarian, under the direction of the commissioner, shall have all of the
11 powers of the commissioner and shall have general charge of the enforcement of this chapter.
12 Complaints under RSA 644:8, 644:8-a, 644:8-aa and any other law pertaining to the abuse of domestic
13 animals, as defined under RSA 436:1, shall initially be filed with the local law enforcement agency, animal
14 control officer, state police, or sheriff which has jurisdiction over where the animal is located or kept. At
15 the request of the local law enforcement agency, animal control officer, state police, or sheriff, the state
16 veterinarian shall assist in a secondary capacity in enforcing the provisions of and investigating said
17 complaints. ~~[In the event the commissioner becomes incapacitated or a vacancy occurs in the office, the~~
18 ~~state veterinarian shall perform all the duties of that office during any such incapacity or until any such~~
19 ~~vacancy is filled. The commissioner may direct the state veterinarian to act for him or her in an official~~
20 ~~capacity whenever he or she may be absent from his or her duties.]~~

21 6 Repeal. RSA 644:8, IV-a(b), relative to livestock confiscation, is repealed.

22 7 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2027.
