HOUSE BILL ***179-FN***

AN ACT relative to hazardous waste accident fees.

SPONSORS: Rep. Proulx, Hills. 15

COMMITTEE: Environment and Agriculture

ANALYSIS

This bill changes the fee for nonpayment of hazardous materials or waste accident expenses to \$1,000 per day after 90 days of nonpayment.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Nonpayment Fees for Hazardous Materials Accidents.. Amend RSA 154:8-a, II-a(h) to read as
2 follows:

3 (h) A [~~one-time~~] penalty of \$1,000 ***per day***, plus interest assessed at the rate of interest
4 established in RSA 336:1, may be assessed for nonpayment ***after 90 days of nonpayment***.

5 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2026.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill changes the penalty for nonpayment of hazardous materials or waste accident expenses from a one-time penalty of \$1,000 to a penalty of \$1,000 per day after 90 days of nonpayment.

If a party liable for costs related to a hazardous materials or waste discharge or accident under RSA 154:8-a does not pay within 90 days, there may be addition fine revenue to a municipality in which the discharge occurred to reimburse the municipality for emergency response, mitigation and legal costs. The impact on local revenue is interminable as it is unknown how many of such accidents may occur and when the liable party will pay for the costs incurred.

The Department of Safety states this bill will have no impact on the Department.
