HOUSE BILL ***85-FN***

AN ACT relative to temporary licensure for student respiratory therapists.

SPONSORS: Rep. C. McGuire, Merr. 27; Sen. Carson, Dist 14; Sen. Murphy, Dist 16

COMMITTEE: Executive Departments and Administration

ANALYSIS

This bill allows for the temporary licensure of student respiratory therapists and authorizes the office of professional licensure and certification, in consultation with the advisory board of respiratory care practitioners, to adopt rules governing this temporary licensure.

AN ACT relative to temporary licensure for student respiratory therapists.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Paragraph; Respiratory Care Practice; Definitions. Amend RSA 326-E:1 by inserting
2 after paragraph XII the following new paragraph:

3 XIII. "Respiratory care student" means a person who is enrolled in a respiratory care
4 educational program.

5 2 New Paragraph; Respiratory Care Practice; Rulemaking. Amend RSA 326-E:2 by inserting
6 after paragraph VI the following new paragraph:

7 VII. The temporary licensure and scope of practice of student respiratory therapists under
8 RSA 326-E:3-a.

9 3 New Section; Respiratory Care Practice; Temporary Licensure for Student Respiratory
10 Therapists. Amend RSA 326-E by inserting after section 3 the following new section:

11 326-E:3-a Temporary Licensure for Student Respiratory Therapists.

12 I. A student enrolled in a respiratory care educational program may apply for a temporary
13 student license in accordance with rules adopted by the executive director, in consultation with the
14 advisory board, pursuant to RSA 541-A.

15 II. A student who has obtained a temporary student license and who is employed in a
16 healthcare setting may render respiratory care services only under the supervision of a licensed
17 respiratory care practitioner for a limited period of time. The scope of practice of the student
18 respiratory therapist is limited to those activities for which there is documented evidence of
19 competency and under conditions specified by rule, pursuant to RSA 541-A.

20 4 Respiratory Care Practice; Exemptions from Licensure. Amend RSA 326-E:6, I(a) to read as
21 follows:

22 (a) A person matriculated in an education program approved by the board who is
23 pursuing a degree in respiratory care or respiratory therapy from satisfying supervised clinical
24 education requirements related to the person's respiratory care education while under direct
25 supervision of a respiratory care practitioner or physician. ***Respiratory care services may be***
26 ***performed without a license by a student when these services are related to the clinical***
27 ***aspect of a student's course of study.***

28 5 Respiratory Care Practice; Responsibilities of the Respiratory Care Practitioner. Amend RSA
29 326-E:8, III to read as follows:

30 III. Each licensee shall provide his or her employer with a copy of his or her license,
31 conditional license, ***temporary student license***, current renewal verification or proof of

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1 reinstatement of license. This copy shall be available for public review upon request. The employer
2 shall maintain a list of all persons providing respiratory care at his or her facility for review by the
3 executive director upon request.

4 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
