MOTION TO PRINT REMARKS

Before we get on to the duty of looking at the bills that have been vetoed, I'm going to take a couple of minutes. First of all, this is very likely the last time we will meet prior to the new term. As we have done before, we'd like to recognize those of you who have made the decision not to run again or seek a different office. If you're not running for the House again, please rise when I call your name so we may thank you for your service.

And I would ask that everybody hold off your applause until I read the complete list. Before we move on, I'd just like to highlight that we have almost 100 members not running again collectively representing 370 years of service in this institution. I'd like to read off the members, those that have been here for 10 years; Barry Faulkner, Sue Newman, Sue Vail, Catherine Sofikitis, Kate Murray, Keith Ammon, Jim Fedolfi, Thomas Kaczynski, Dan McGuire, Katherine Prudhomme-O'Brien, Kimberly Rice, Len Turcotte, Kevin Verville, Mark Warden. 12 years; Patricia Cornell, Christopher Herbert, Mike Edgar, Linda Gould, Doug Thomas, Michael Vose. 14 years; Dick Ames, George Sykes, Linda DiSilvestro. 18 years; Larry Gagne, Rick Ladd, Carol McGuire. 20 years; Tom Bucu. 26 years; Jim MacKay. 28 years; Marjorie Smith. 30 years; Susan Almy. And God bless you, 40 years. 40 years; Phyllis Katsakiores. So, all of those rise and let's give a round of applause to all those that aren't returning. Phyllis, I'm only four years behind you. I want to uh take a minute to thank all of you. I've had the privilege of being the Speaker of this House for the last six years. Our accomplishments I think have been unknown in past history and unbelievable. Now I know my friends over here on this side of the aisle probably didn't agree with a lot of our policy and I'm sure my friends over here in this aisle didn't agree with some of their subjects. But look at what we did. For years, we've needed a new parking garage. Now we have one. All of those that used to park in Storrs, I hope you had a much shorter walk getting here today. The LOB needed refurbishing and that'll be done for next session. Completely from top to bottom. You'll have a just about brand-new building except for the outside walls over there, with all new furniture, all new chairs, all new lighting, much better. Unfortunately, the men's bathroom on this floor will not be open for another month or so, but other than that, all the bathrooms will be done. We instituted streaming for all our committees, which we never had before. And numerous other things that we have done in the past six years as a legislative body. I congratulate all of you. As you know, I will not be returning as Speaker. I am not running for Speaker again. Hopefully I'll be returning and I'll be sitting somewhere out in the audience with all of you. This has been one of the highlights of my life. What we've accomplished in the past six years I think has been extraordinary considering we started out in COVID and uh we still have the satisfaction, I think you might call it, of having the only, the only, session outside in a parking lot in the United States history. And for those of you who were there for that wonderful event on January 6th, you'll notice that all of you that were there were in your cars sipping your coffee or maybe something stronger. I don't know. But as I was standing up there with my nice big fuzzy hat and my five layers of clothing getting very cold on a nice January day in New Hampshire. Thank you. Thank you all. I will miss being up here, but it's time I move on and it's somebody else's turn. Thank you.

GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE ON HB 396

Agriculture is an important part of our state's economy and heritage, and I appreciate the bill's intent to provide additional meat processing access for small farmers and producers. Unfortunately, this proposal violates the federal Meat Inspection Act as confirmed in a letter written to the Commissioner of Agriculture Shawn Jasper by Acting Administrator of the Office of Investigation, Enforcement, and Audit Food Safety and Inspection Service of the USDA. New Hampshire has not established its own Meat and Poultry Inspection Program and therefore, the state relies on federal inspection of these products. The USDA stated that they routinely provide inspection to low volume, seasonal or infrequent producers and are willing to work with local producers to meet their needs. They also noted that they "were not aware of any outstanding or unmet requests for inspection" in New Hampshire. They offered time and resources to work with the state to reduce the burden on small producers. I am sensitive to the needs of our small producers and will instruct the Commissioner of Agriculture to convene a group of our small producers to discuss a path forward that does not violate federal law putting these local producers at risk for federal action and creating potential food safety issues. For these reasons, I have vetoed House Bill 396.

DEBATE ON HB 396

Speaker Packard: The House will attend to the governor's veto message on House Bill 396, relative to processing of cattle, swine, sheep, and goats at facilities not certified by the United States Department of Agriculture. The question before the House is notwithstanding the Governor's veto, shall House Bill 396 become law? The Chair recognizes Representative Comtois.

Representative Comtois: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Honorable colleagues, we are being told once again that the sky is falling. We hear about millions of eggs entering our food supply, salmonella outbreaks, contaminated lettuce across more than 40 states, and tens of thousands of pounds of raw meat entering the country without

going through the inspections we expect. Yet too often consumers don't even know where their food came from unless they are paying close attention to labels and government recalls. So I ask you, do we really believe that large food conglomerates are more trustworthy than farmers in our own communities? For generations, New Hampshire has believed in knowing your farmer and knowing your food. We have trusted our farmers to raise our family's milk, vegetables, poultry, and other food. We have heard the warnings before. When New Hampshire changed its raw milk laws, we were told there would be disastrous consequences. The sky was supposed to fall. It didn't. In fact, New Hampshire became a national leader in food freedom. Our rabbit and poultry farmers have been able to sell directly to restaurants. Farmers have been raising and processing animals such as red deer, bison, and elk under our state laws. These practices have existed for years, and the sky has not fallen. So why are we telling a New Hampshire farmer that they can raise an animal, care for it, feed it, and sell it to their neighbor, but cannot sell that customer a cut of meat from an animal processed on their own farm simply because it was not processed at a USDA inspected facility. Think about the families who buy a quarter or half a cow, pig, or lamb directly from a local farmer. How many of those families do you know who have become sick because they purchase meat directly from a farmer who they know and trust? We should take food safety seriously. But food safety and food freedom do not have to be enemies. We can protect consumers while also giving New Hampshire farmers a chance to compete and families a chance to afford locally raised food. For years, this House has studied this issue. I know because I sponsored legislation that created those study committees. The commissioner participated, the USDA participated, farmers, consumers, and other stakeholders participated. We studied the problem. We discussed the concerns. We look for solutions. And yet, after all those years, we are still telling our farmers to wait. How long are we going to push this issue down the road? How long are we going to make consumers pay more for locally raised meat simply because of where that animal was processed? And how long are we going to tell our farmers, we trust you, but not quite enough when it comes to your cow? We trust these farmers with our milk. We trust them with our vegetables. We trust them with our rabbit and poultry. But somehow when it comes to a pig, a lamb, or a cow, we suddenly say they cannot be trusted. This bill does not force anyone to buy this meat. It does not eliminate consumer choice. It does the opposite. It gives consumers another choice. If someone wants meat processed at a USDA inspected facility, that option remains. If someone wants to buy directly from a farmer they know and trust under New Hampshire law, that choice should remain available to them as well. That is what freedom looks like. Our farmers deserve the opportunity to make a living. Our consumers deserve to afford food, and New Hampshire deserves a food system that gives people more choices, not fewer. We have said for years, know your farmer, know your food. Let us mean it. Let us trust our farmers. Let us trust our consumers to make informed decisions. Let us give New Hampshire families a chance to put affordable, locally raised food on their tables. Now is the time to act. Please vote to overturn the Governor's veto and let's make New Hampshire number one for healthy, affordable food. Thank you.

Speaker Packard: The Chair recognizes Representative Potenza.

Representative Potenza: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. It's frankly ridiculous that I have to stand here today advocating for the override of a veto of a nonpartisan bill that strengthens our local communities. This is about food affordability, food security, food safety. It's about giving New Hampshire farmers another opportunity to serve their neighbors. I often speak about the level of division in this chamber, but I also point to the Environment and Agriculture Committee as an example of what this body should be. We work together. We debate. We listen. We put policy over personalities. When the evidence supports a bill, Republicans and Democrats vote together. HB 396 is one of those bills. A Democratic member of our committee from Nashua, who is not running for reelection, who has supported this legislation for years, often reminds us of what we witnessed during COVID. Empty grocery shelves, broken supply chains, communities relying on local farms. We learned that resilient food systems begin locally. That's why we passed the Homestead Food Act and HB 396 follows that same principle. The national political stage is watching New Hampshire because this bill aligns with two bipartisan efforts in Washington. The Prime Act and the mandatory country of origin labeling. One expands opportunities for local meat processing. The other gives consumers honest information about where their beef comes from. Both are supported by Republicans, Democrats, and Independents in Congress. I think Ro Khanna showed up here about a month or so ago and he is a co-sponsor on one of this legislation. This has actually never been a partisan issue. The amount of work that my friend from Barnstead and our committee have invested in this bill over several years has been amazing. Unfortunately, so has the misinformation surrounding it. Let's remember what this bill actually does. It does not force anyone to participate. It does not eliminate federal inspection. It simply gives New Hampshire farmers another option if they choose to use it while giving consumers more local choices. That is freedom. That is local control. That is exactly what many of us campaign on. Americans are beyond frustrated with a food system dominated by just four companies controlling roughly 80 to 85% of beef processing. Small farmers wait months for processing while families pay higher grocery prices. HB 396 is a modest but meaningful step toward giving independent farmers a fighting chance. I also have to point out the inconsistency in some of the arguments against this bill. Many of the same people who support states pushing back against federal policy in other areas suddenly argue we cannot do so here. Colorado and

Washington legalized recreational cannabis despite federal law. Many states resisted Real ID. This year, we passed an egg bill that diverged from federal standards. And in 2023, New Hampshire allowed deer, elk, and bison to be processed, sold under the state inspection rather than USDA inspection. So, bison is okay, deer is okay, elk is okay, but cattle are somehow different. How does that make any sense? If we truly believe states are laboratories of democracy, New Hampshire should not be afraid to lead. This bill is supported by farmers, consumers, and people across the political spectrum because everyone understands that affordable, locally produced food strengthens our communities. This override is not about politics. It's about trusting New Hampshire farmers. It's about consumer choice. And it's about stronger local food systems. I'm going to end with this. For all of those that are seeking re-election, because I am not, remember this; your constituents are totally paying attention. They care about grocery prices. That's all I hear when I'm out knocking doors. They care about supporting local farms. They are tired of corporate consolidation. They want more local choices from in-state trusted sources. Today, we have an opportunity to stand with them. I respectfully ask you to vote to override the governor's veto of HB 396. Thank you.

Speaker Packard: The Chair recognizes Representative Bixby.

Representative Bixby: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. So, I am going to request that we sustain the veto on HB 396. So, what this bill attempts to address a real problem which is the shortage of slaughter capacity in New Hampshire. Federal law requires USDA inspection of the slaughter of cows, swine, goats and sheep, referred to as amenable animals, and we have only have four slaughter facilities in the state that can do that do this under federal inspection. What we really need is more slaughter facilities to enter the market. But, that's something we can't legislate from this location. What this bill does is it attempts to circumvent federal law by saying that is okay for someone to slaughter a small number of animals each month on their own farm, that is cows, that is the amenable animals. So the problem here is the state can't override federal law and it does look like the current farm bill that is working its way very slowly through Washington does have some parts, related to the Prime Act that the previous speaker mentioned, that would in fact provide some sort of relief but that hasn't made it through Congress yet and when it does make it through Congress, I would be very happy to work on legislation to help align our laws with that new federal law, if it makes it through, in order to allow more locally done slaughtering in New Hampshire. However, until that happens, we are putting people in jeopardy by trying to override federal law through state law. So, uh, this bill does not work. When it came out of, House E&A, it was pretty good but had a few flaws. The Senate, our friends on the other side of the wall, excuse me, took a bill with a few minor flaws and made it a lot worse. So one of the things that they have done is they have taken fairly transparent label labeling. So the House version said you had to say on the label that it was slaughtered at the farm and they have said and they've changed that to initially processed. What does that mean? So we're moving into Orwell territory here. We don't need to do that in New Hampshire. The Senate took out the part that requires that the health of the herd for amenable animals needs to be inspected by a veterinarian every year. So there's absolutely no health inspection left in this bill. The Senate removed the requirement that the farmers who take advantage of this are aware that it is not consistent with federal law. So, a farmer may not be aware that they're breaking federal law when they're doing this, but they are. Another big problem is the Senate added a training component to be put together by the Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food in order to farmers who are doing this. Now, it would seem like that would make sense except the department has no expertise in training. They usually contract that out to the cooperative extension, but there is absolutely no money in the bill to allow them to either put together something in-house or to contract that with the cooperative extension. So, what this does is it puts both, the department and cooperative extension, between a rock and a hard place because if we pass this, they will be violating federal law if they don't put together a training program, they'll be violating state law. If they don't put together a training program, they'll be violating federal law if they do put together a training program. So this is uh really not a good way to move forward on this program and I think that it was appropriate that the Governor vetoed this and I hope that we will sustain that veto today. Thank you.

Speaker Packard: We're on the last speaker. Remember this will be a roll call vote. So if everybody takes their seats it'll save some time. The Chair recognizes Representative Tremblay.

Representative Tremblay: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. House Bill 396 is simply a bill of choice. If you want to buy your cattle, swine, sheep, or goat from a local farmer without USDA inspection, you can. If you want to buy the previously mentioned meat from Hannaford's, Market Basket, or God forbid, Walmart, you can. Freedom is scary. It is however the bedrock of our form of government. Please vote green to override the governor's veto on this bill. Thank you.

Speaker Packard: The state constitution requires a roll call. A two-thirds vote is required to override a veto. The Chair recognized Representative Germana for a parliamentary inquiry.

Representative Germana: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, if I know that I voted for this bill in committee because I think it is our responsibility to do everything that we can to support our farmers in New Hampshire. But if I also know that immediately following that vote, I was inundated with phone calls and emails and conversations around my community from farmers who told me how much they oppose this

bill because they're concerned that just one outbreak can do irreparable reputational harm to our small producers. And finally, Mr. Speaker, if I know that the body on the other side of the wall weakened important protections that our committee worked so hard to include in the original version, would I vote red to sustain the governor's veto? Thank you.

Speaker Packard: The Chair recognizes Representative Judy Aron for a parliamentary inquiry.

Representative Judy Aron: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, if I know that the nation, the entire nation, is watching us in New Hampshire and someone needs to step up and be the first to push reforms that support small farmers, and if I know corporate conglomerates are stopping federal law from changing so it won't be changed anytime soon, and if I also know that USDA certified facilities in New Hampshire are scarce, not always trustworthy, expensive, and booked out many months in advance, creating bottlenecks that drive up the cost of food, and if I also know that this bill has many guard rails included to keep our food supply safe and if I also know that this bill is not a mandate to every farmer, but will allow some farmers to challenge federal law which will not change anytime soon as I've said, and it restricts their rights right now to sell directly only to their New Hampshire customers, and finally, Mr. Speaker, if I know that overriding this veto is about affordability, about supporting our local farms, and about keeping the government out of decisions that should be made between a New Hampshire farmer and a New Hampshire customer, would I then press the green button to override the governor's veto and support small farmers in New Hampshire? Thank you.

Speaker Packard: If you're in favor of having a the bill become law, you will press the green button. If you are opposed and wish to sustain the governor's veto, you will press the red button. Voting stations are open for 30 seconds. Have all members present had an opportunity to vote? House will attend the state of the vote. With 204 voting yea, and 116 voting nay, the motion fails to get to two-thirds. The Governor's veto is sustained.

GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE ON HB 1072

While this bill is the product of thoughtful conversations and important considerations, it unnecessarily restricts the Department of Labor's critical authority to swiftly respond to emergent situations where employers have failed to pay wages to their employees. New Hampshire families depend on timely paychecks, and we cannot delay the Department's ability to react in those circumstances. For these reasons stated above, I have vetoed House Bill 1072.

I support expansion of the research and development tax credit to encourage businesses to continue to invest in innovation and the creation of new products, however, inexplicably, the legislature tacked onto it unrelated changes to the State Park fee structure that will have a negative impact on our self-funded parks and tourism. The Commissioner of the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources testified before the legislature about the detrimental impact of the park fee change proposal on our parks and the bill was killed as a standalone. Adding it back at the last minute to a positive tax credit expansion does not suddenly make it a good policy, and thus, I have vetoed House Bill 1102. I will work to make the expansion of the research and development tax credit law by including it in my next budget proposal. For these reasons, I have vetoed House Bill 1102.

This bill seeks to address the housing access problem of renters who do not meet existing landlord-defined renter criteria such as credit history, income, prior evictions, or references. While improving housing access is essential, requiring these prospective renters to provide potentially thousands of dollars more than current law upfront would impede access to housing. Moreover, the bill's language is not clear on how long a landlord can keep those funds and allows landlords discretion to unfairly withhold tenants' deposits. MOTION TO PRINT DEBATE

Rep. Germana moved that the debate on **HB 1442-FN**, permitting classification of individuals based on biological sex under certain limited circumstances, be printed in the Permanent Journal.

DEBATE ON HB 1442

Speaker Steven Smith: The House will attend to the governor's veto message on House Bill 1442 permitting classification of individuals based on biological sex under certain circumstances. Representative Wade is recognized to speak.

Representative Wade: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. During the last debate on HB 1442, I was told that these bills aren't about me. I was told that I am effectively one of the good ones. I was told that because the member from Derry couldn't tell I was trans just by looking at me, that meant that I was safe and that I wouldn't have been discriminated against under this bill. And by saying that I would be safe, that admits to everyone in this room that the enforcement mechanism being used is based on whether someone passes purely based on their appearance. But appearance is not definitive proof and it will result in the exact situations that I've warned about time and time again. Some women look masculine. Some men look feminine, not by choice, but just from their genetics. Because people look different. Some men have high-pitched voices. Some women have low pitched voices. Someone's voice is not proof. Hair length is not proof. Clothing is not proof. Our bodies don't all fit into these categories. And that's okay. You can't use these arbitrary metrics because none of them work in the real world. That goes for restrooms and for every other scenario listed under this bill. If someone commits a crime in the restroom, arrest them, prosecute them. It doesn't matter if they're trans or not. The actions of individuals do not permit you to discriminate against an entire class of people and ban them from public life. That is by definition collective punishment. And lastly, I want to address the point that this bill isn't about me because it absolutely is according to the language written in it. It doesn't matter that I'm seven years into my transition and haven't stepped foot in a men's room for all of that time. It doesn't matter that I've had bottom surgery because I don't have functional ovarian tissue and because my SRY gene wasn't expressed in fetal development 24 years ago, none of that matters according to this bill. I've gotten to know many of you in my first term as a state rep, and you might think that I am the exception and not the rule when it comes to trans people, but that's not true. I am by most accounts an average transwoman. Most of us are terrified to come out publicly because many people who've known us for years have never learned about our identity. Every person in this building has probably used the restroom with a transperson. And guess what? You were fine. You survived because nothing happened. Even when I go to the doctor's office, sometimes they ask me when my last period was to put on my chart after I've told them that I'm trans. If they can't tell, how do you think this is going to go? When a stranger says, "Oh, I think your voice was a little low pitched," and tries to call the cops on you. It's not going to work that way. Congresswoman Nancy Mace is the one who led the charge on implementing a bathroom ban in the US Capitol building, and literally a few weeks after they instituted that policy, she followed a tour group that was just browsing the capital and enjoying their time. She followed them into the restroom and accused them of being trans, and she was wrong. This has happened so many times where there are going to be these false positives and that is why this bill is unenforceable, plain and simple. Even attempting to enforce it creates so many privacy concerns and false accusations that it would only create an environment of fear for everyone who doesn't fit the stereotypical definition of masculine or feminine, whether they are trans or whether they aren't. Last time I asked if you could prove that I am transgender, and I received no answer. Now, I'd ask you, if you were accused of being transgender, how would you prove that wrong? Because that is what will happen all across this state if we pass this bill. And that is why the Governor rightly vetoed it. That is why once again, I am urging all of you to put this issue to rest by pressing the red button so we can focus on the actual issues that matter to our constituents. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Representative Steven Smith: Thank you. That was awesome. I just had to think it. Representative Layon is recognized to speak.

Representative Layon: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. As the member from Derry who was referred to by the previous speaker, I would like to note that it was a gross mischaracterization of what was said in the debate, and unfortunately, that's consistent with the debate on these bills. There are many things that are said and bounded about that are really not the issue. The issue here is the fact that the trans community has failed to police themselves and others who are claiming a trans identity. The problem here is that there has been nothing that has come forward in order to deal with people who are falsely claiming an identity in order to act get access to women's bathrooms and girls bathrooms. There is nothing that is being done from the community who says that their rights are being violated and instead it's our right to violate the rights of girls. We need everybody to stand together and ensure that we do not have predators hiding under the label of transgender. And now

Speaker Steven Smith: The House will be in order. The member will suspend for a minute. I'd like to point out she came over here a little wound because she believed that her statements were being mischaracterized and she stayed over there silent while the other member continued. She deserves the same courtesy whether you like what she's saying or not. The member will continue.

Representative Layon: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We need a solution to people who are getting access to spaces uh for nefarious reasons. We would like to have one that does not impact people who are just going about their business and trying to go to the bathroom. The ball is in your court to overturn this and make sure that the women's rooms are women's rooms or to make sure that we do that the community polices people who are just trying to get inappropriate access. Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and please vote to overturn the veto.

Speaker Steven Smith: Representative Heath Howard is recognized.

Representative Heath Howard: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The arguments against basic human rights and the dignity of trans people are, as they always are, disingenuous, based not in fact, surrounded by fear, and built with ignorance, and often openly cruel. The policing of who uses which bathroom is designed to alienate, humiliate, and harms trans people, but will inevitably lead also lead to the harassment against anyone whose appearance doesn't fall in line with other people's expectations of gender. And for anyone who wants to make this discussion about mutilated children, I ask you to put even a fraction of the energy being concerned about this into the arms manufacturers right here in New Hampshire that are making weapons that mutilate and kill children in Palestine as well as our schools across this country. Basic civil rights for trans people should not be up for debate. They never should have been, and they certainly shouldn't be now. Stop this culture war and vote red. Thank you.

Speaker Steven Smith: Representative Kuttub, if that is indeed your name, is recognized.

Representative Kuttub: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. My apologies for before. This bill is really about privacy and dignity, and privacy and dignity should not be controversial. The majority of restrooms are designed differently based on biological differences between men and women. And they're labeled men and women. There are some family rooms, but most restrooms are labeled men and women. And there's an expectation when you enter a restroom that's labeled women that there's going to be other women in there. And you're expecting to have that privacy. This isn't to degrade anybody. It's meant that everybody should have that privacy. And when you expect that there's only going to be somebody in there that's a woman, that should be how it is. This bill only applies to bathrooms, locker rooms, sports, prisons, and mental health hospitals. And it doesn't mandate that it has to happen. It just says that if a business wants to give that respect between a man and a women's room that they can and that that's not discrimination. For years and years and years, we've had men and women's rooms. We don't have many co-ed bathrooms or co-ed locker rooms. If they were meant to be co-ed, it would just say co-ed. It wouldn't say men and it wouldn't say women, but they don't. They're not co-ed. So, I ask you to overturn the veto. I know that many won't change their mind on it, but I do think that dignity and respect shouldn't have to be controversial. Thank you.

Speaker Steven Smith: This will be a roll call vote. Members, take your seats. The question before the House is notwithstanding the Governor's veto, shall House Bill 1442 become law? Representative Wade is recognized for parliamentary inquiry.

Representative Wade: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. If I know that HB 1442 is one in a long line of bills state-wide and nationwide that seeks to roll back non-discrimination protections for trans people, and if I know that I would also support increasing privacy in restrooms by having the door actually go down to the floor, and I think that would frankly be better for everyone involved, and if I know that these bathroom ban bills have been vetoed by Governor Sununu and Governor Ayotte five times in the last two years. And finally, if I know that passing this bill will only create an environment of fear and does nothing to protect any of our constituents than would I now press the red button to sustain the governor's veto?

Speaker Steven Smith: Representative Kuttub is recognized for parliamentary inquiry.

Representative Kuttub: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. If I know that women deserve privacy, and if I know that if a bathroom is labeled women, that women should be in that bathroom. And if I know that multiple genders are meant to be in a location that it could otherwise be labeled co-ed and that entering a woman's space is not proper, then would I now press the green button to override this veto? Thank you.

Speaker Steven Smith: This is a roll call vote. If you're in favor of the bill becoming law, press the green button. Opposed, press the red. Voting stations are open for 30 seconds. Have all members present had an opportunity to vote? The House will attend to the state of the vote. 165 in the affirmative, 149 in the negative, the veto is sustained.

The House recessed at 12:19 p.m.

GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE ON HB 1491

Risk pools are cooperative self-insurance organizations that allow our municipalities, counties, and school districts to manage health care costs and other risks instead of utilizing commercial insurance. Predictability is essential to deliver on this goal, which means reserves driven by actuarial expertise and operations following industry best practices. Unfortunately, both bills reforming risk pool operations fail to deliver on these needs. HB 1491 creates a "choose-your-own-regulator" model that dilutes necessary oversight. SB 661 arbitrarily caps reserves to manage liabilities as well as mandating an immediate policy change impacting current health care policies for hundreds of municipalities and school districts across the state. As we have seen from recent risk pool failures, this is an important policy area to get right and these proposals need more work. For those reasons, I have vetoed HB 1491 and SB 661.

GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE ON HB 1643

The role of the guardian ad litem is to assist the court in determining the best interests of the child. To that end, under current law guardians ad litem are directed by the court to gather information and, only if specifically requested by the court, make certain recommendations relating to parenting plans, schedules, and decision-making responsibilities. Ultimately, the court is responsible for making determinations relative to a child's welfare. This bill would strip the authority of the court to request a guardian ad litem provide recommendations for consideration by the judge and limits information available to the court, which could impede its ability to ensure the best interests of a child. For the reasons stated above, I have decided to veto HB 1643.

GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE ON SB 434

This bill is similar to the bill I vetoed last year. As a parent, I understand and appreciate the concerns parents have about their children being exposed to age-inappropriate or objectionable materials in schools. At the same time, existing New Hampshire law already requires school districts to adopt a policy allowing an exception to specific course material based on a parent's determination that the material is objectionable. See RSA 186:11:IX-c. Parents must be notified at least two weeks in advance of course materials that involve human sexuality, sexual education, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or gender expression. If a parent objects in writing, New Hampshire law further requires an alternative agreed upon between the school district and the parent. As current law provides a mechanism for parents through their local school district to exercise their rights to ensure their children are not exposed to inappropriate materials, I have vetoed Senate Bill 434.

SENATE MESSAGE

The Senate has voted to override the Governor's veto on the following bill:
SB 661-FN, relative to pooled risk management programs.

GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE ON SB 661-FN

Risk pools are cooperative self-insurance organizations that allow our municipalities, counties, and school districts to manage health care costs and other risks instead of utilizing commercial insurance. Predictability is essential to deliver on this goal, which means reserves driven by actuarial expertise and operations following industry best practices. Unfortunately, both bills reforming risk pool operations fail to deliver on these needs. HB 1491 creates a "choose-your-own-regulator" model that dilutes necessary oversight. SB 661 arbitrarily caps reserves to manage liabilities as well as mandating an immediate policy change impacting current health care policies for hundreds of municipalities and school districts across the state. As we have seen from recent risk pool failures, this is an important policy area to get right and these proposals need more work. For those reasons I have vetoed HB 1491 and SB 661.

SPECIAL REPORT TO THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES REGARDING COMPLAINT 2026-3

I. Introduction

The Legislative Ethics Committee received three complaints in March of 2026, regarding the conduct of Representative James A. Spillane with respect to postings he made on the social media website "X." The complaints were made by Representative Paul S. Berch, Representative Cathryn A. Harvey and Representative Timothy Horrigan (the Complainants). The Complaints alleged that Representative Spillane violated certain provisions of the Ethics Guidelines.

Following an initial review of the complaints, the Committee conducted a preliminary investigation, in accordance with its procedural rules, and voted unanimously to initiate formal proceedings to inquire into the complaints. A formal statement of charges and notice of hearing was sent by certified mail to Representative Spillane on May 29, 2026, and a formal hearing was held before the Committee on June 24, 2026. Representative Spillane formally answered the statement of charges and appeared at the hearing represented by counsel.

II. Charges

The conduct alleged in the complaints and which formed the basis of the formal charges is as follows: Making postings on the social media website "X" in which he identified himself as "Representative James Spillane," which included comments that were offensive and demeaning about other House members. More specifically, when Representative Horrigan responded to his posted description of Representative Harvey as a "liar," Representative Spillane referred to Representative Horrigan as "retarded," commented that his mother had "f---d (middle letters deleted) her cousin," and accused him of dropping acid in the 60's.

The Committee charged Representative Spillane with violations of the Ethics Guidelines, Section 1, Principles of Public Service, Paragraph III, Principle of Accountability, which provides that legislators "shall ensure that government is conducted openly, equitably and honorably in a manner that permits the citizenry to make informed judgments, have confidence in the integrity of the legislature, and hold government officials accountable" and Paragraph IV, Principle of Conduct, which provides that legislators "shall treat each other, legislative employees, and the public with dignity and respect."

III. Defenses

The facts underlying the charges in this proceeding are undisputed. Representative Spillane (the "Respondent") admits that he posted to the social media website the language referred to in the complaints and that the posts identified him as "Representative James Spillane."

With respect to the specific charges, Representative Spillane's answer, as well as his position as articulated at the hearing, is that his posts to the social media website were not made in the performance of his duties as a member of the legislature and, therefore, his conduct does not fall within the jurisdiction of the Committee. He also answered that the comments he made in the social media posts are protected speech under the federal and New Hampshire constitutions.

IV. Analysis

Counsel for Representative Spillane filed a Motion to Dismiss the charges, alleging that the Committee lacked jurisdiction because Representative Spillane was not acting in the performance of his duties as a legislator. The Committee denied the Motion to Dismiss. The Committee found that the authorization of jurisdiction specifically addresses conduct "related" to legislative duties. RSA 14-B:1, III defines "jurisdiction of the committee" as "those actions which allege a violation of law, guideline, rule, or regulation and relate

to the conduct of individuals in the performance of their duties as members, officers, or employees of the legislature.” In this case, the Respondent identified himself as “Representative James Spillane.” The email exchange specifically involved the participation of the Complainants on legislation sponsored by Representative Spillane, which the Complainants had opposed. The social media comments clearly relate to the performance of his duties as a legislator.

Representative Spillane alleges that he was free to make the comments included in his postings and any restriction would constitute a violation of his freedom of speech under both the state and federal constitutions. That is not at issue in this case. The Committee is not questioning Representative Spillane’s legal right to say what he said in the social media posts. While he may have a legal right to make offensive or demeaning comments about other members, the legislature also has the authority to establish standards and to regulate its membership, which includes the power to sanction legislators for violating those standards.

What must be considered by the Committee is whether Representative Spillane’s conduct is consistent with established ethical guidelines established by the General Court. The Committee will make a recommendation. Ultimately, it is up to the House of Representatives to decide whether Representative Spillane has violated its established ethical standards and, if so, should be accordingly sanctioned.

While the right of freedom of speech is fundamental, it is not absolute. Certain categories of speech, such as defamation and harassment, can be restricted. In this case, Representative Horrigan testified that the offensive statements made in the posts were not true. Representative Harvey testified that she had legitimate concerns about her safety.

It is not uncommon for legislators to disagree over the substance of legislation. Legislators may also express their disappointment or unhappiness over legislative outcomes. While that may even lead to unpleasant exchanges at times, it is expected that such matters will be resolved in a manner consistent with the standards for legislative decorum and without the need to impose sanctions.

In ordinary circumstances, such matters do not rise to a level which warrants ethical intervention. They do not raise concern over confidence in the integrity of the legislature, nor do they demonstrate complete disrespect and indignity for other members of the legislature. But here, Representative Spillane has publicly made extremely offensive assertions about another member, calling him “retarded,” alleging he “dropped acid in the 60’s”, and, perhaps most offensively, asserting that his mother engaged in sexual activity with her cousin. This is not an acceptable disagreement over a legislative outcome. It is a direct personal attack. It demonstrates a complete lack of respect and absolute lack of concern for the dignity of another representative. The public postings published by Representative Spillane are clearly defamatory of another member of the legislature, Representative Horrigan. His comments were demeaning and constituted harassment. His conduct cannot be viewed in a manner consistent with the established ethical guidelines established by the General Court.

While not considered in determining the merits of these complaints, the Committee notes that the Legislative Ethics Committee previously found Representative Spillane culpable of an ethical violation involving his use of social media. In its published admonishment, the Committee stated: “When you use your title or include your legislative position at the top or bottom of your social media postings, your postings should reflect the best principles of public service. When you put something on social media as a member of the General Court, you have a duty to know how it will affect others.”

V. Conclusion

Based upon the evidence, the Committee has found by clear and convincing evidence that the charges are true. He publicly posted demeaning and offensive comments on social media that were defamatory and intended to harass another representative. The conduct of Representative Spillane is in violation of Ethics Guidelines, Section 1, Principles of Public Service, Paragraph III, Principle of Accountability, and Paragraph IV. Principle of Conduct. VI. Recommendation The Committee recommends that Representative Spillane be censured by the House of Representatives for his violation of the established Ethics Guidelines.
