

Many of our schools are decades old and in poor condition. Residents are reluctant to increase their taxes even when they agree the investment is needed. The state was once a reliable partner through the School Building Aid program. The 10-year moratorium on its funding has exacerbated the problem to the point where a substantial infusion of state funds is needed. We funded just 3 of 17 applications this biennium - a disservice to the students in the 14 schools that did not make the cut. This will not attract or retain the young families our economy needs. New Hampshire's traditional public schools serve the vast majority of students and their families; that is where we should be investing in education.

HB 366 changes the \$50M maximum to a \$60M minimum annual spend allowing for a few more new projects to move forward while also offering partial and gradual compensation to those communities that acted during the moratorium. Regarding the projects during the moratorium, HB 366 seeks a compromise – only half the amount that should have been provided had the program been funded. Whether your school is on the wait list, the list of projects done during the moratorium, or among those yet to apply for building aid, we need to take this small step toward helping students and taxpayers across the state.
