Dear Chairman Ladd and members of the Education Funding Committee,

The New Hampshire Council of Churches, representing seven denominations and over 300 churches across the state, strongly supports HB 665 because no child should go hungry, especially in a place of learning. Our faith traditions teach us to care for the most vulnerable among us, ensuring that children have access to nutritious meals is a fundamental expression of that commitment. By increasing the income eligibility for free school meals to 300% of the Federal Poverty Level, this bill will provide essential nourishment to thousands of children who might otherwise go without, helping them focus on their education rather than their empty stomachs. Research shows that food-insecure children are more likely to struggle with concentration, experience higher rates of absenteeism, and perform worse on standardized tests compared to their peers.

Hunger should never be a barrier to learning. When students are well-fed, they are better able to concentrate, participate, and succeed in school. This small investment in children strengthens communities across the Granite State for the span of their lives.
