Dear Madam Chair and Members of the Committee:


As Director of Public Policy for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Manchester, and on behalf of Bishop Peter Libasci, I write to respectfully register our support for HB 1469.

The Catholic Church at both the local and international levels considers human trafficking to be one of the great evils of our age. “Human trafficking is an open wound on the body of contemporary society...It is a crime against humanity.” Pope Francis, *Address to the Participants in the International Conference on Combating Human Trafficking*, April 10, 2014. “The whole of society is called to grow in this awareness, especially with regard to national and international legislation, in order to prosecute the traffickers and redirect their unjust gains to the rehabilitation of the victims.” Pope Francis, *Address to the Participants in the Plenary Session of the Pontifical Academy of the Social Sciences*, April 18, 2005.

HB 1469, like HB 1458, would continue the critical work of countering the scourge of human trafficking in New Hampshire. As demonstrated by the many people who testified at the hearing on this bill, our state is fortunate to have a unified commitment on this front from law enforcement, state and local lawmakers and officials, health care providers, and advocates. For the reasons well-expressed at the hearing, we believe that HB 1469 will promote human dignity and the common good, and therefore we ask that you recommend the passage of HB 1469.
