

A Testimony in Opposition to HB1520

Chairman Rose Berry and the Members of the NH House Election Law Committee:

The following is from the HB1520 Bill Details, "Citizen of this state" means a man or woman native born or a person naturalized as a citizen of the state of New Hampshire.

Citizen of this state does not exist when New Hampshire residents are citizens of the United States. No one should be directed to make a pledge to the State of New Hampshire.

There are already registration and voting barriers and HB1520 would cause more voter suppression and confusion.

Valuable time is being wasted by the sponsors of HB1520. It is far from sensible when every election at every level of government, voters are encouraged to vote as citizens of the United States.

The long-term goal of sponsoring this bill is illegal.

*(74 U.S. 700), decided in **1869** (not 1859), is a landmark U.S. Supreme Court case holding that the Union is indissoluble and that individual states cannot unilaterally secede.*

Ruling on Secession: *The Court held that the Constitution looks to an "indestructible Union, composed of indestructible states," and therefore, secession is not constitutionally possible.*

Plus, politicians do not decide who can vote. HB1520 should be ITL
