**REQUESTED ACTION**

Pursuant to the provisions of RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Public Health Services, to accept and expend federal funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF), in the amount of \$6,000,000 to address the negative financial impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, effective upon approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council through June 30, 2025, and further authorize the allocation of these funds in the account below. This is an allowable use of ARPA SFRF funds under Section 602 (c)(1)(C) for provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue. 100% Federal Funds.

**EXPLANATION**

The purpose of this request is to provide one-time financial support to eight New Hampshire Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) and one FQHC Look Alike. FQHCs are federally funded nonprofit health centers that serve medically underserved people and communities. FQHCs provide preventative, primary care services regardless of ability to pay, offering a Sliding Fee Discount Scale to eligible patients. FQHC Look-Alike health centers are also community-based health care providers that meet the requirements of a FQHC and serve similar populations, but do not receive additional Federal FQHC funding. The COVID-19 pandemic caused these FQHCs to experience significant financial challenges due to increased service demands, rising operational costs and staffing shortages, and changes in insurance reimbursement.

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FQHCs serve as a critical safety net for healthcare access in New Hampshire. They act as the medical home and provide wraparound services for low-income, uninsured, and under-insured individuals, children and families. They employ highly trained medical providers and care coordination staff with the experience and access to resources to address complex needs.

Funds are budgeted as follows:

Class 041 – RSA 124:16 requires .1% to be budgeted to pay for financial and compliance audits.

Class 102 – The funds will be used to enter into agreements with FQHCs.

Source of Funds: These funds are 100% Federal Funds.

In the event that Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.

**REQUESTED ACTION**

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI the New Hampshire Department of Corrections (DOC), respectfully requests authorization to accept and expend \$574,937 of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) for the purpose of a unified digital evidence project and to purchase handheld x-ray technology. This is an allowable use of ARPA SFRF funds under Section 602(c)(1)(A) to respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2025. 100% Federal Funds

Funds are to be budgeted in FY 2025 in the following account *ARPA FRF-Safety through Technology* 02-46-46-460510-XXXX0000<sup>1</sup> as follows:

## EXPLANATION

These funds will allow the Department to implement a unified digital evidence project and to purchase handheld x-ray technology. These funds will allow the department to purchase hardware and software subscription to expand the department's digital evidence capabilities with Fusus. Today, the department uses digital evidence technology with body worn cameras (BWC) and in-vehicle cameras (IVCs). Footage and data related to the BWCs are stored online in Axon's evidence.com digital evidence platform. This funding would allow the department to move all cameras' video/digital evidence, including fixed facility security cameras, BWCs, and IVCs, into a central repository in evidence.com. It will also provide upgrades to the fixed facility security camera systems to allow for secure remote access (i.e. from the state's emergency operations center) in times of crisis. In addition, this software can store TASER® data.

This tool will also add needed capabilities to the department's digital evidence system, allow investigators to access critical digital evidence conveniently and remotely, and help to phase out old and outdated analog video recording equipment. Another added benefit of transitioning all videos to evidence.com is the ability for the department to eliminate flash or thumb drives and writing DVDs. Evidence.com through Axon and Fusus has the capability to securely share digital evidence through downloadable links with a built-in audit tracker, thus increasing the department's capacity to share discovery materials timelier with the Attorney General's Office, the Conduct Review Committee, prosecutors, and the courts.

This funding will also allow the Department to purchase handheld x-ray backscatter imaging system that sees items that are otherwise invisible to the human eye. In turn, this system can help officers detect concealed contraband, weapons, narcotics, contraband cellphones and other threats. This imaging system is a safe, high-quality, low-energy imaging technology that is superior to others and is widely used by the United States Department of Homeland Security. This system will allow for a more effective deployment of correctional law enforcement officers, with one using the x-ray technology to swipe through searching cells for contraband and another law enforcement officer reviewing the "hot" items with the suspected contraband. The devices are capable of "seeing through" a multitude of materials: stainless steel toilets, peanut butter, concrete for false spaces, and more. The enhancement of x-ray technology in this function will create safer facilities and use correctional law enforcement officers time more effectively.

Funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Class 030 – Equipment to purchase handheld x-ray imaging system.

Class 037 – Hardware for the digital evidence project.

Class 038 – Software for the digital evidence project.


Class 040 – Indirect Costs to recover, per by RSA 21-1:75, a proportional share of the outside funding source to alleviate agency indirect costs.

Class 041 - Audit Fund Set Aside to comply with RSA 124:16 that requires all agencies that receive federal funds to set aside a percentage (0.1%) of the federal revenue amount received to pay for financial and compliance audits.

This is an allowable use of ARPA FRF funds under Section 602 (c)(1)(A) to respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts. In accepting ARPA SFRF funds, the Department agrees to

work collaboratively with the Governor's Office for Emergency Relief and Recovery to ensure accurate and timely reporting to U.S. Department of Treasury on the use of the funds.

## INFORMATIONAL ITEM

Relative to a request made by the Fiscal Committee at the February 16, 2024 meeting, the Governor's Office for Emergency Relief and Recovery (GOFERR) respectfully submits information summarizing unobligated American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) made available from previously approved requests in order to reallocate funding to other projects that will be submitted separately to Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council for approval at future meetings.

Attached you will find a table in Exhibit A, outlining the previously approved programs from which funding has been designated as available for reallocation. This table is retrospective from February 2024 on, meaning Exhibit A shows the funds designated as available for reallocation from February 2024 to present. The total amount designated as available for reallocation is \$83,921,178.

As you are aware, at the Fiscal Committee meetings from February to present, this Committee approved various programs to be funded with these reallocated funds. The total reallocated and approved by this Committee is \$67,218,149 (\$26,192,670 in February, \$13,194,915 in March, \$5,200,000 in April, and \$22,630,564 in May). This leaves \$16,703,029 available for reallocation as of this date. There are four items on the Committee's agenda today, requesting use of these reallocated funds.

GOFERR anticipates that more funds will become available for reallocation in the near future, and will be preparing similar informational items in the future to notify the Fiscal Committee of any such funds.
