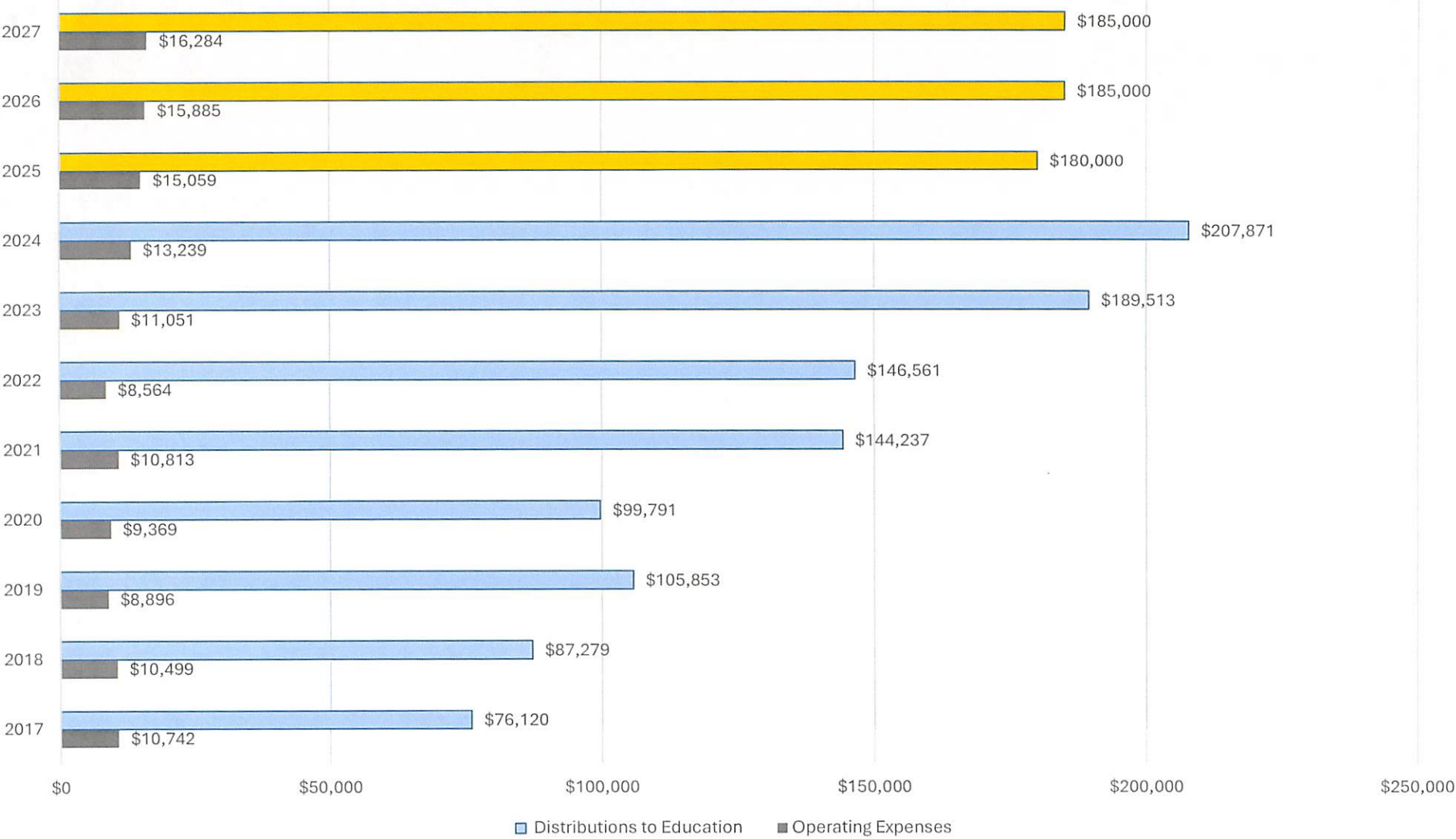

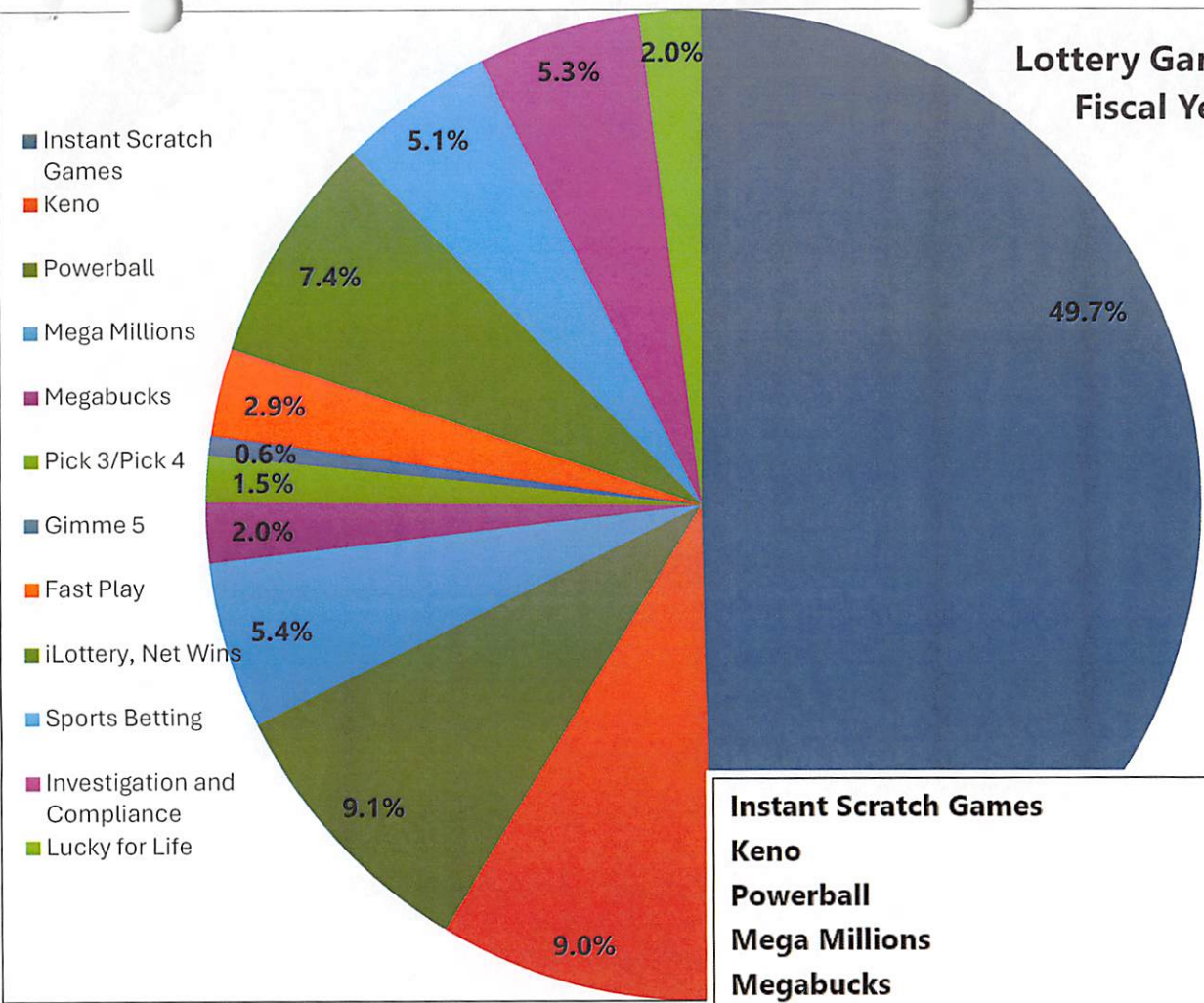

## **PRIORTIZED NEEDS**

### **\$100,000:**

The NHLC Commission's security system is extremely outdated. The current operating system is Windows 7. This is no longer compatible with State servers. Both interior and exterior cameras are outdated. The Lottery feels it is important to not only protect and secure the safety of its staff, but also the general public that visits and purchases tickets in our Sales Office. This update is long overdue and is necessary to function in a secure manner.

### **\$30,000:**

The NHLC purchased it's building in 2019. The Lottery currently does not have handicap accessible doorways to the building or public restrooms. We serve the public with our sales office on a daily basis and feel it is important to have the building comply with current ADA standards expected from all State buildings throughout the State.
