Rep. 5. The Committee discussed Interim Rule 2025-1 from the Department of Safety (After Market Tinting Restriction With & Without Medical Waiver). Karen Schlitzer testified on behalf of the Department. The Department made an oral conditional approval request to amend the rules.

Rep. McGuire moved to conditionally approve Interim Rule 2025-1 based on the oral conditional approval request.

Rep. Layon seconded.

Adopted.

6. Sen. Lang discussed OR 2024-126 from the Board of Dental Examiners, and OR 2024-234 from the Board of Psychologists, noting the Committee had not yet received responses to their preliminary objections and that the deadlines for those responses were not yet due.
7. The Committee discussed Emergency Rule 14198 from the Liquor Commission (Rules Relating to Particular Licensees). The Committee took no action.
8. The Committee discussed adjournment. By consensus, the Committee adjourned at 9:09 a.m.
